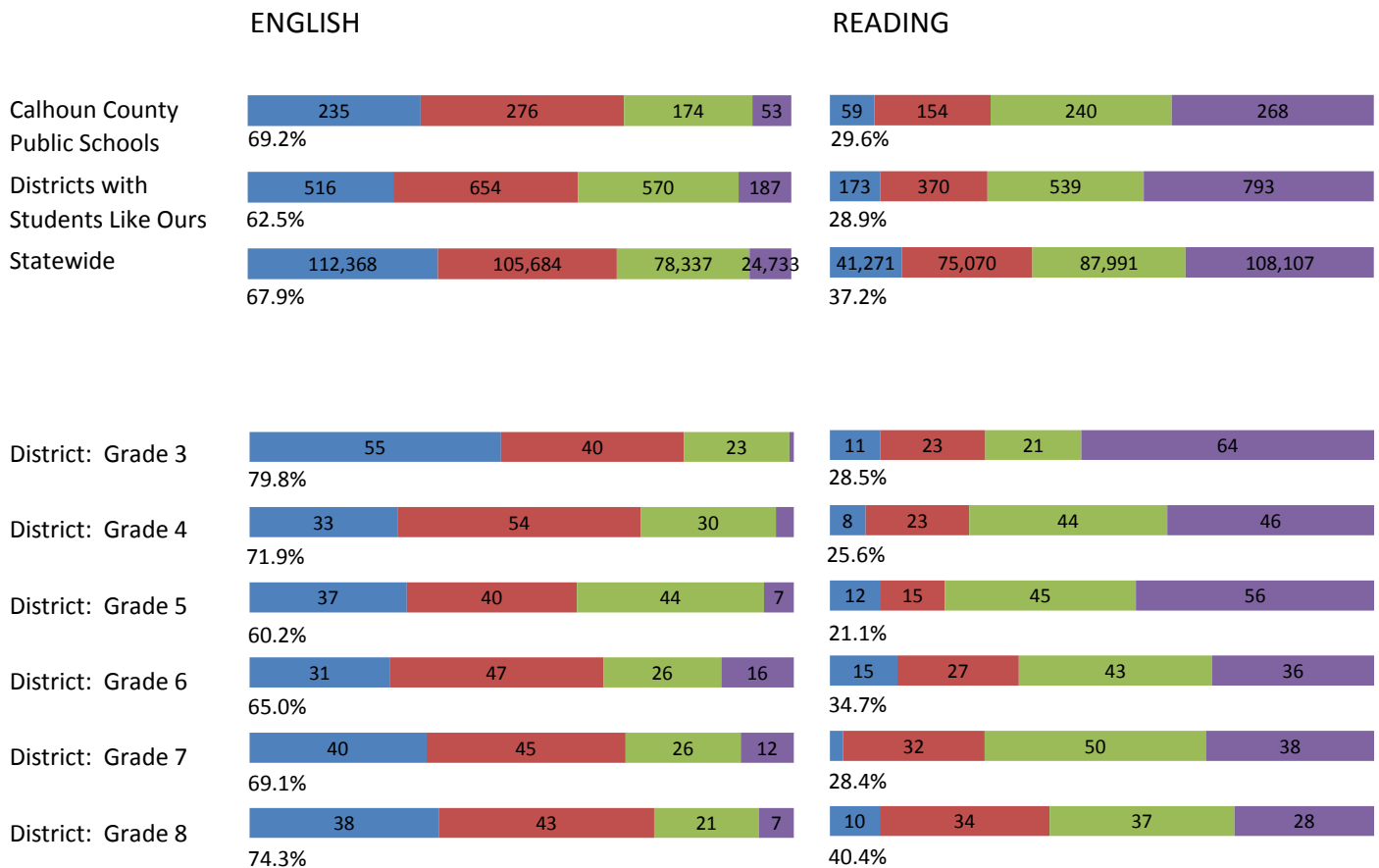

Our district is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by encouraging excellence in "Teaching and Learning". Our teachers are dedicated and provide students with quality instruction and experiences. Our students are provided with an array of opportunities through clubs, athletics, science fairs, Montessori instruction, field trips and many other activities designed to enhance our "Teaching and Learning" process. Our teachers are involved in professional development each Tuesday afternoon. These afternoon sessions are designed to promote quality instruction through teaching strategies provided by their peers. Teachers have been afforded lap tops, smart boards, projectors and document cameras. These sessions along with the technology has aided tremendously to the classroom experiences. Teachers have just received training this summer on the digital devices that we will roll out to students in grades 3-8 during the 2015 - 2016 school year. The entire instructional staff will utilize Tuesdays for continued training with the devices. Our students participate in STEM initiatives at the high school and one of our middle schools just received a STEM Grant through Boeing and the University of South Carolina for Project Lead The Way. Four of our teachers were trained to teach the engineering courses at the USC School of Engineering. Many of our students are enrolled in vocational courses, Army JROTC, Teacher Cadets and we now average over 200 students enrolled in dual credit courses through Orangeburg Technical College. These experiences have our students readily prepared for colleges and careers. We, as a school district, are blessed to have involved parents, concerned citizens, many business partners and a supportive School Board. We have completed the AdvancED Standards for continuous improvement and our schools have been awarded Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards over the past several years. The school district has earned excellent ratings on the State Report Card for the past three consecutive years. Our dropout rate is less than 2% and our graduation rate is over 90%. We pride ourselves on student achievement and will continue to provide every opportunity and experience to have our students meet the Profile of the Graduate. 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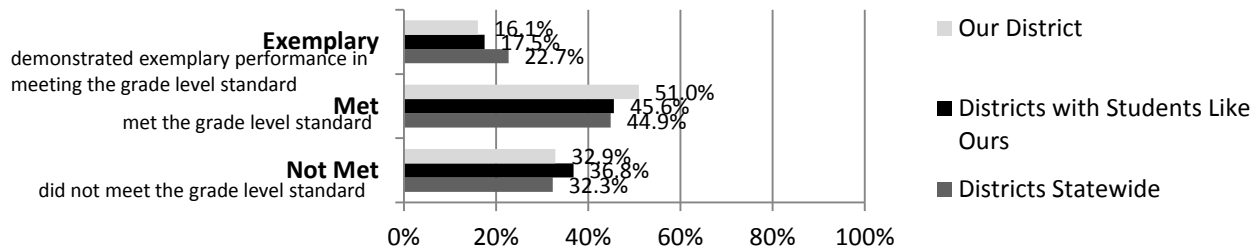

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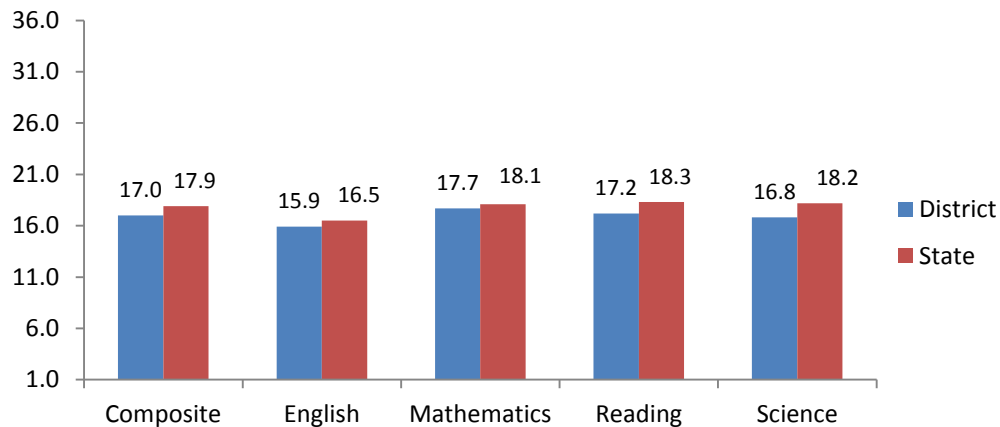

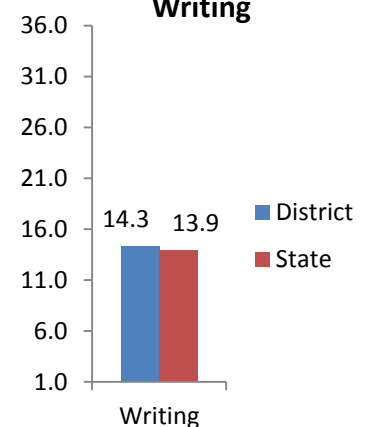
Districts with Students Like Ours are districts with poverty indices of no more than 5% above or below the index for the district.

The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.

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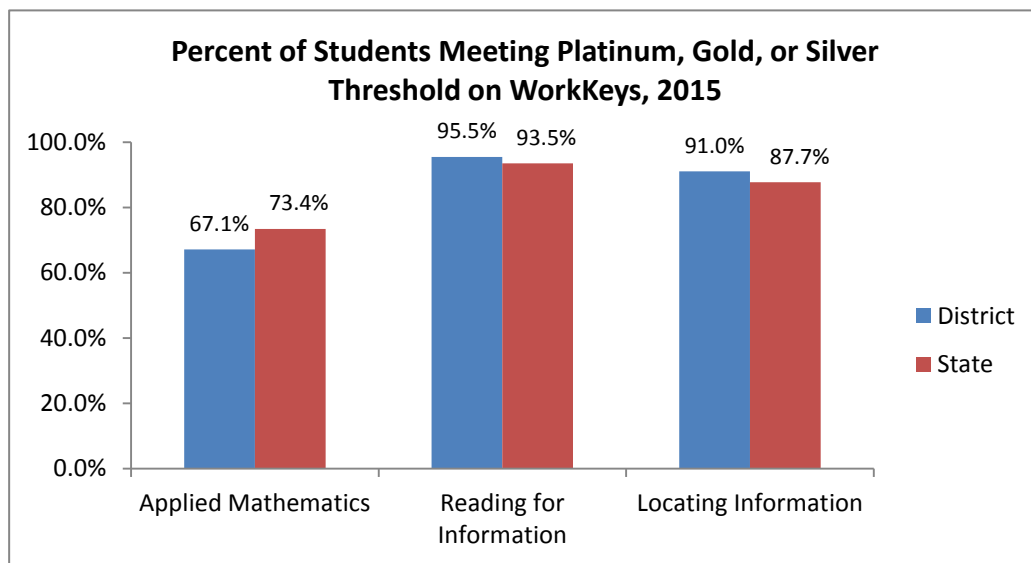
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KNOWLEDGE

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
