The Kershaw County School District (KCS D) is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by ensuring that our students are college and career ready. We provide all students with challenging opportunities in safe and nurturing learning environments.

Through rigorous learning experiences, we inspire students to think critically and solve real world problems. Hands-on technology experiences enrich our students' learning. Student achievement continues to improve at every grade level as teachers differentiate instruction to meet the needs of all learners while disciplinary issues have drastically decreased as a result of our Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) programs. Our students also benefit from partnerships with the Boys and Girls Clubs of the Midlands and the University of South Carolina's College of Social Work.

Reading and writing opportunities across the curriculum are evident in all of our schools. Advanced Placement classes and numerous dual-enrollment courses through a partnership with Central Carolina Technical College provide our students with opportunities to obtain college credit. Our Applied Technology Education Campus (ATEC) allows students to achieve industry-recognized certification in 12 different areas.

KCS D uses its resources wisely to receive optimal results. We are the only Midlands school district and one of only 10 school districts in our state to receive The Center for American Progress's highest possible rating for return on educational dollars spent. The National School Boards Association ranked our school district 7th in the nation for effective use of technology.

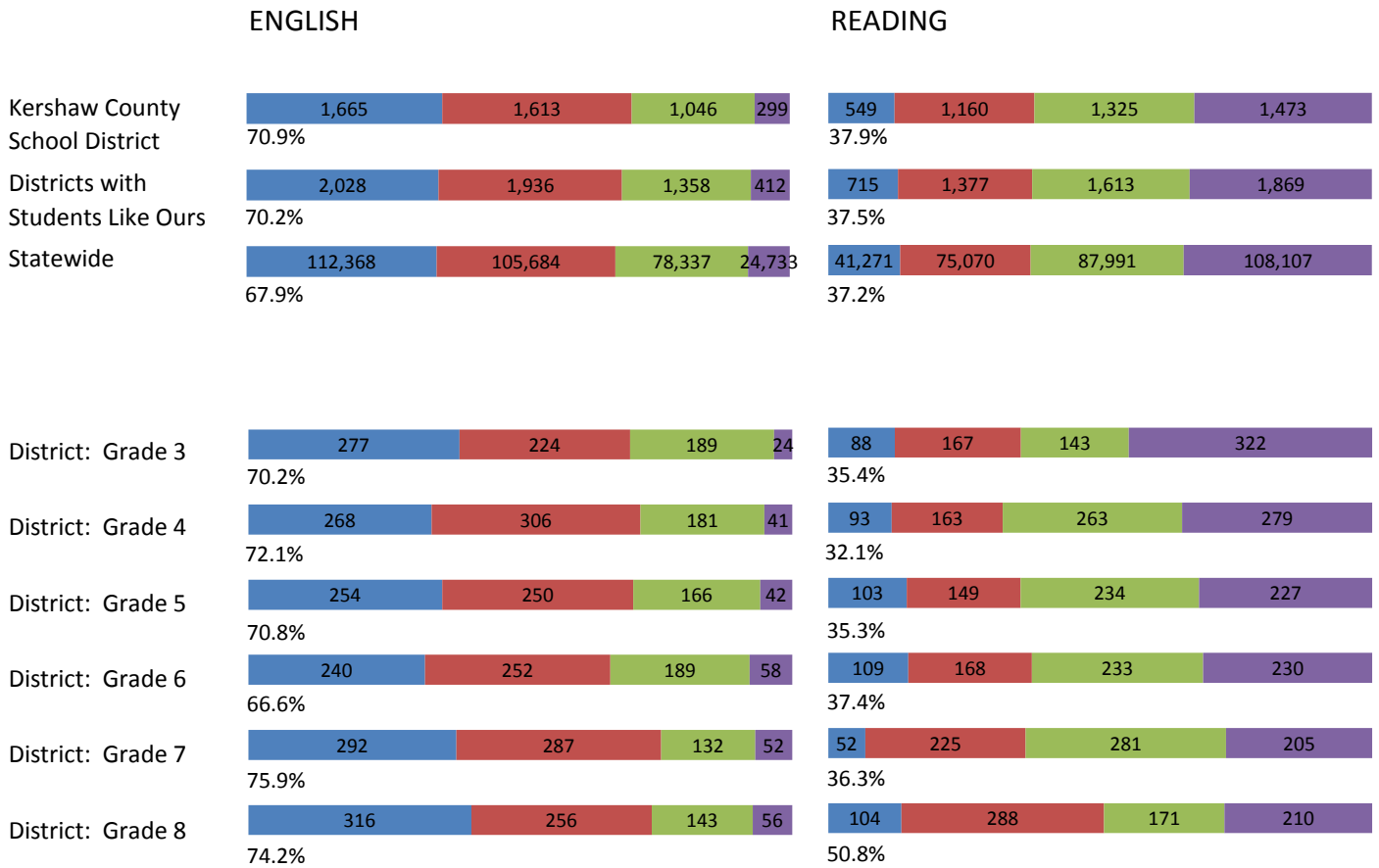
Our academic performance continues to excel as evidenced by the school district's "Excellent" Absolute Rating on the State Report Card, and our Federal Report Card rating being in the top 20 in the state. Our graduation rate is over 90 percent, an all-time high. Scholarships earned by Kershaw County graduates reached \$11.6 million, another record breaker. In the first year of competition, three Kershaw County schools reached the state Quiz Bowl Championships. The District received almost two million dollars in competitive grant funding and direct services to students through grants awarded to community partners.

These accomplishments are a tribute to the excellence of our staff and the unwavering support of our families and the larger community. We look forward to strengthening these partnerships to continue our academic success.

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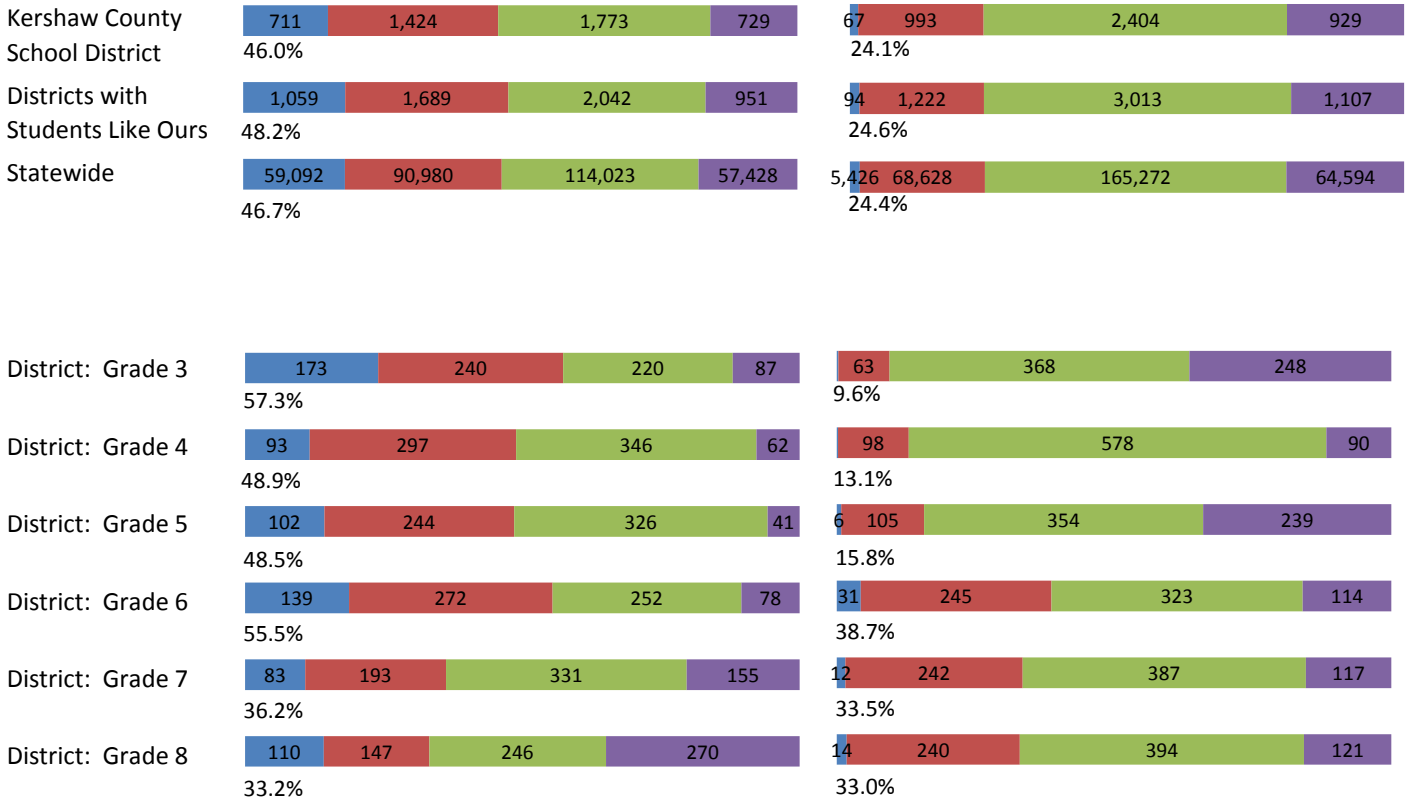

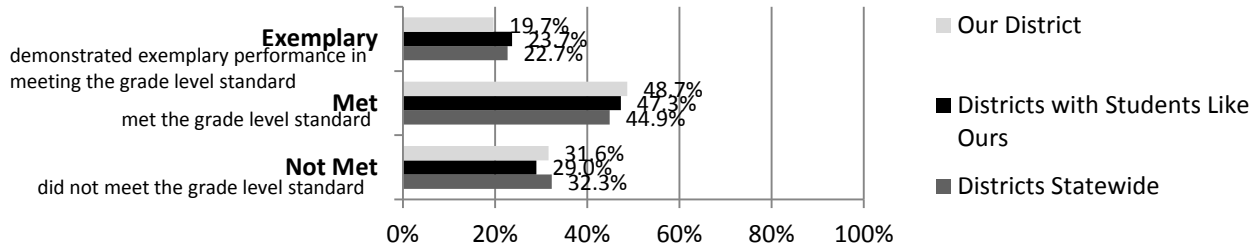
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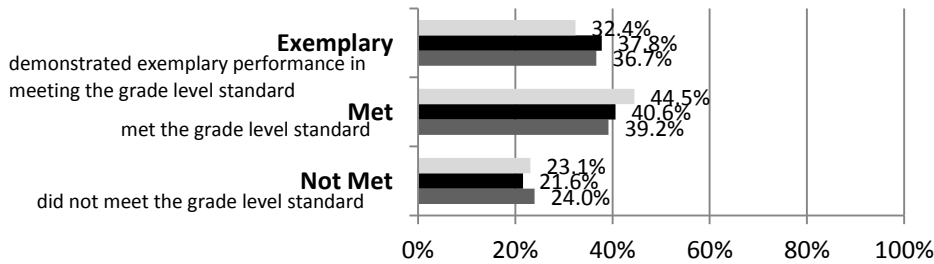

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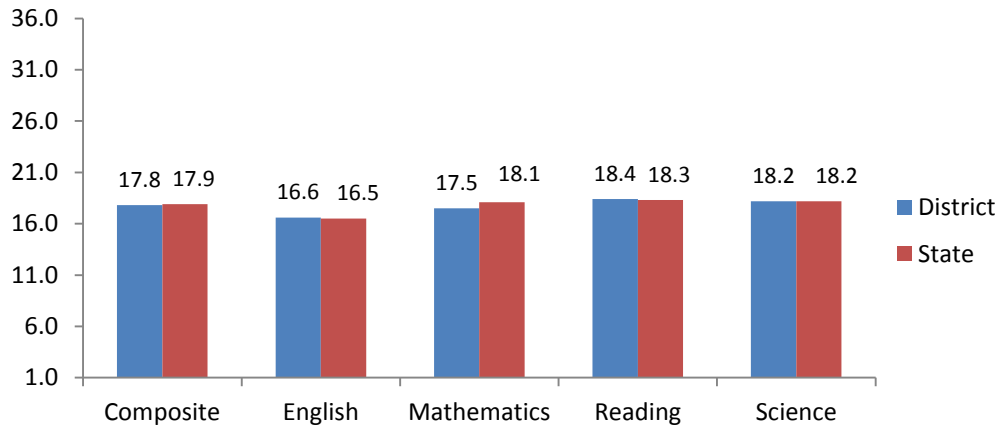

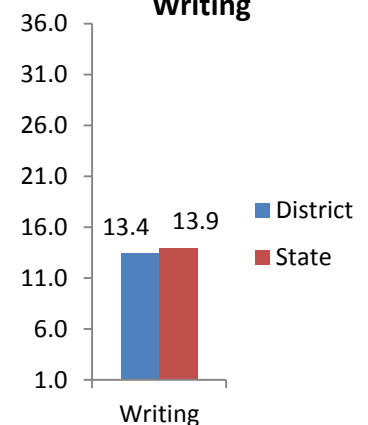
Districts with Students Like Ours are districts with poverty indices of no more than 5% above or below the index for the district.

The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.

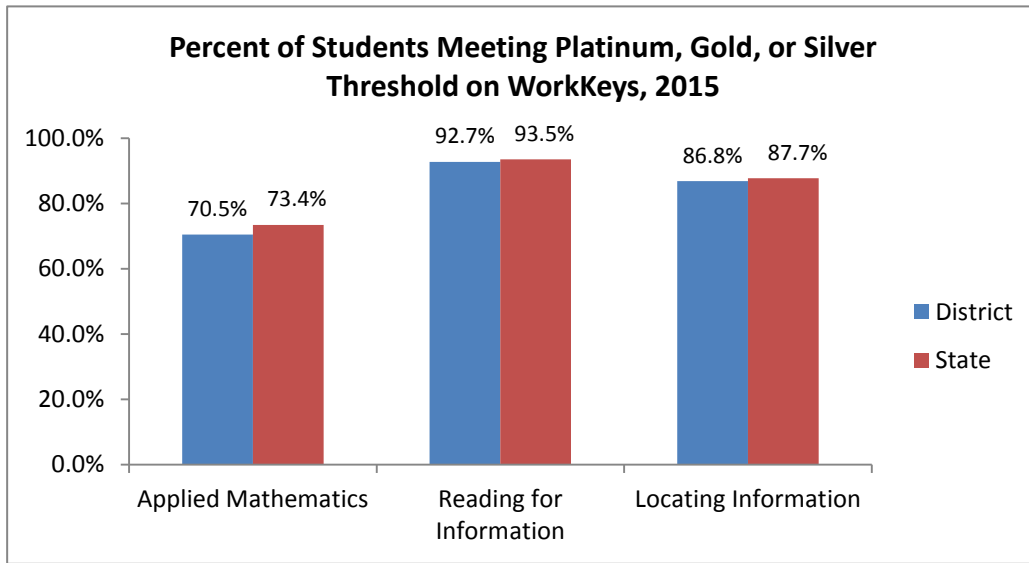

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KNOWLEDGE

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
