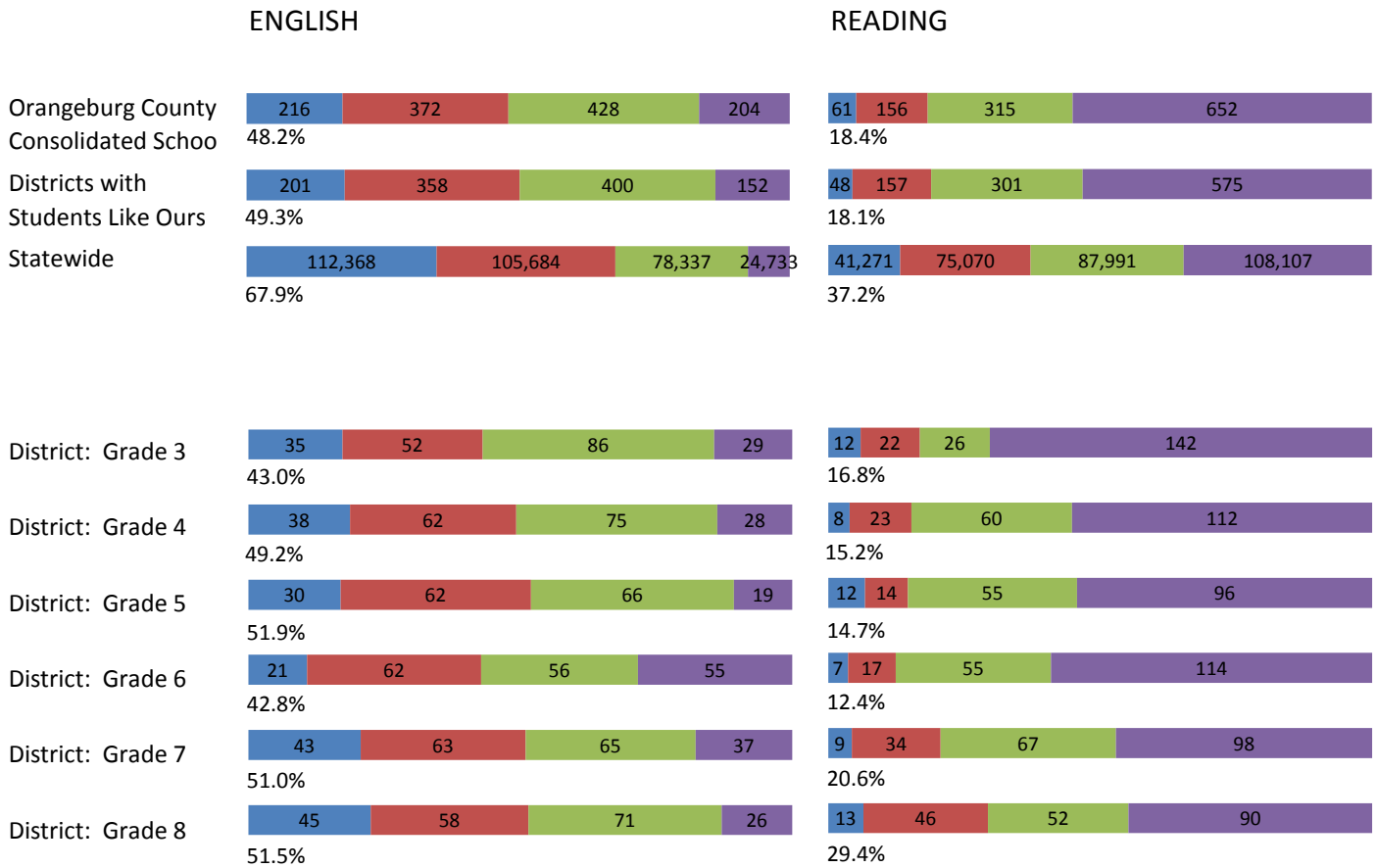

Orangeburg Consolidated School District Three is committed to preparing every student for college and/or career choices. The district devoted the 2014-2015 school year to internal assessments under the leadership of the new superintendent in order to best update the district's strategic plan. This process was driven by collaborative meetings between the superintendent and various internal and external stakeholders, including transition teams that were established at each school. The district continued to implement the Teacher Advancement Program (TAP) for a third year. All six district schools are engaged in a concerted focus on data-driven instructional practices and programs through TAP. As evidence of implementing TAP with fidelity, for example, the South Carolina Department of Education recently removed the state priority school designation from Holly Hill Roberts Middle School based on its significant increase in student achievement. 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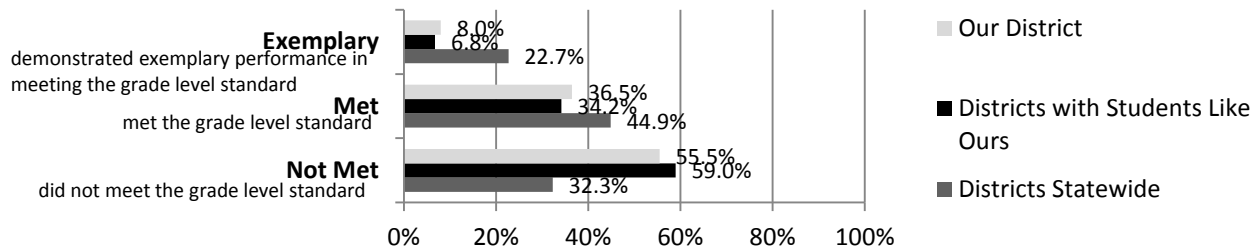
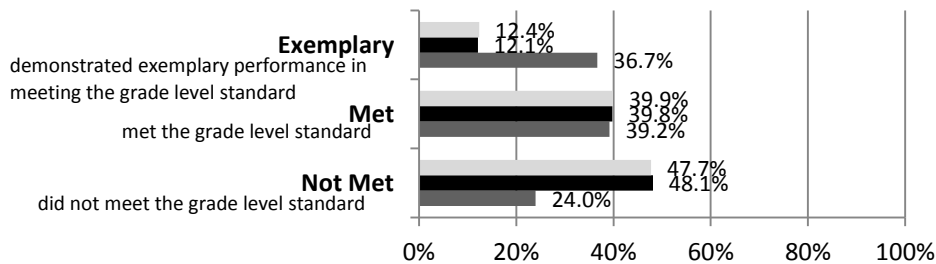
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KNOWLEDGE

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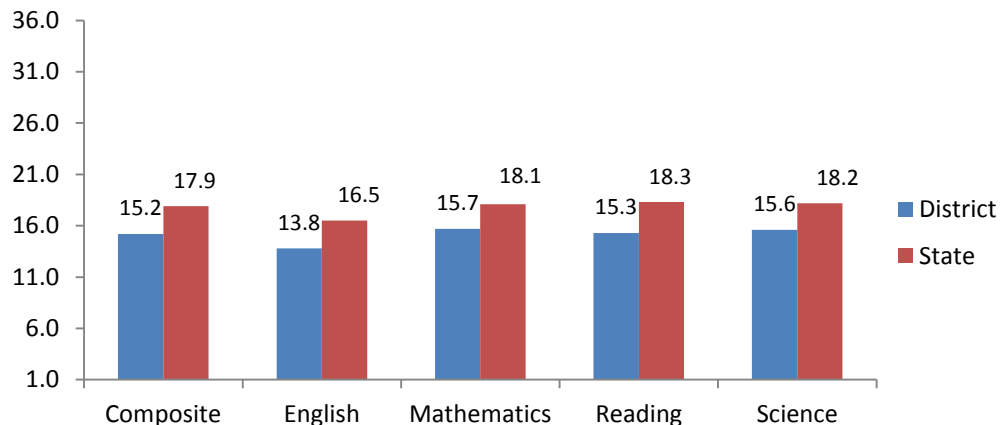

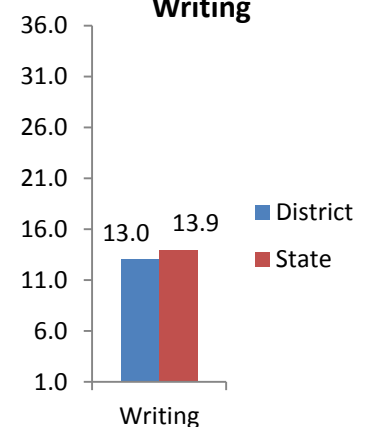
Districts with Students Like Ours are districts with poverty indices of no more than 5% above or below the index for the district.

The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.

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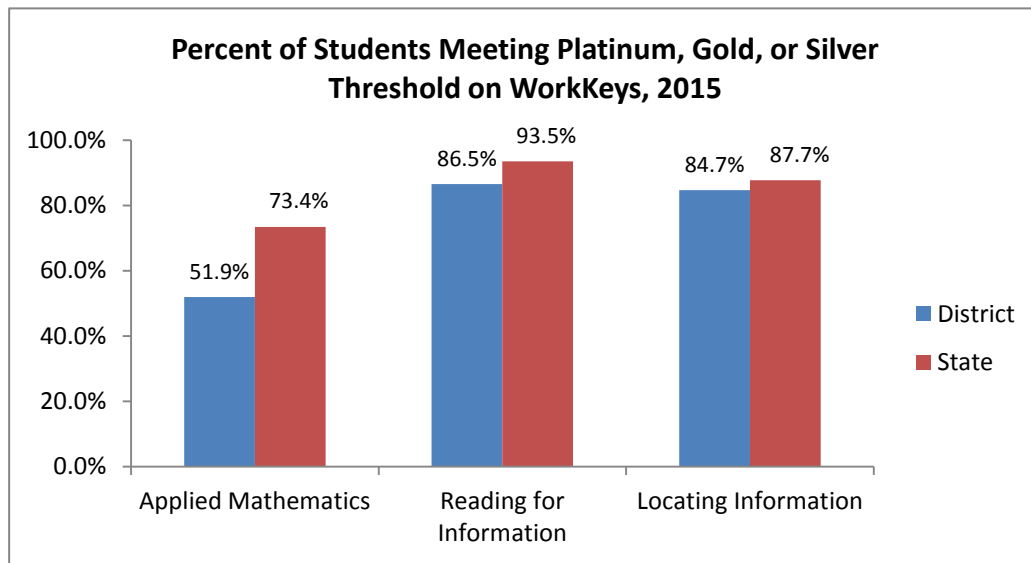
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KNOWLEDGE

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
