The South Carolina Public Charter School District (SCPCSD) helps all students develop world-class skills and the life and career skills specified in South Carolina's Profile of the Graduate by encouraging creativity and innovation in the authorization of new charter schools, holding existing charter schools accountable to the achievement and growth measures outlined in their charters, and providing professional development needed to strengthen all of our schools.

The 2014-15 school year saw the opening of eight new schools, with enrollment increasing from 14,000 to nearly 17,000 students. After several years of overwhelming growth, the district will welcome one public charter school in 2015-16: NEXT Charter School in Greenville, SC.

Under the federal accountability system, six schools received an A. while under the state report card system, eight schools received an absolute rating of excellent: For the district office, the emphasis this year centered on developing a continuum of services that would strike a balance between the responsibilities of being an LEA and the responsibilities of being a charter school authorizer. On the authorizing side, staff worked to implement a performance framework dedicated to holding charter schools accountable for their academic, operational, and fiscal performance. On the LEA side, the district continued to support federal program implementation and special education services to ensure compliance with applicable federal and state law.

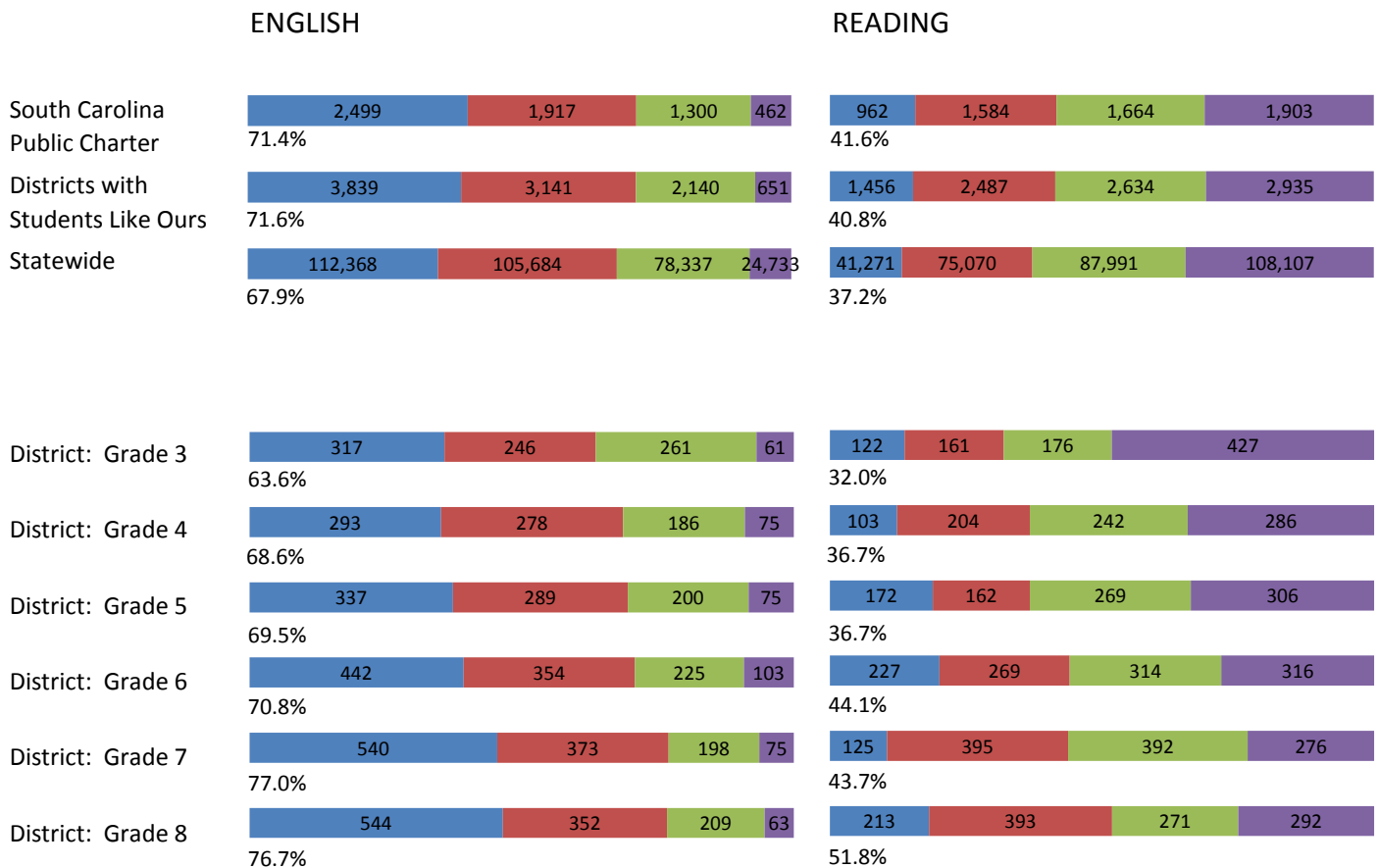
In its ongoing quest to be more transparent and standard in new school authorization, the district developed a published timeline and guidance documents for groups interested in pursuing a charter. The rubric commissioned by the SCDE was utilized for the first time, and the Board of Trustees received a recommendation report for each school that applied. While the legislature continued to demonstrate support of the charter school movement by maintaining the current level of funding, several legislators have asked for further information regarding diversity at the schools within our district. The district continues to collect metrics to best illustrate the diversity of the student population served within our schools. The district hopes that this emphasis on quantifiable information will further reassure legislators and the general public that the SCPCSD takes its responsibility to the taxpayer seriously.

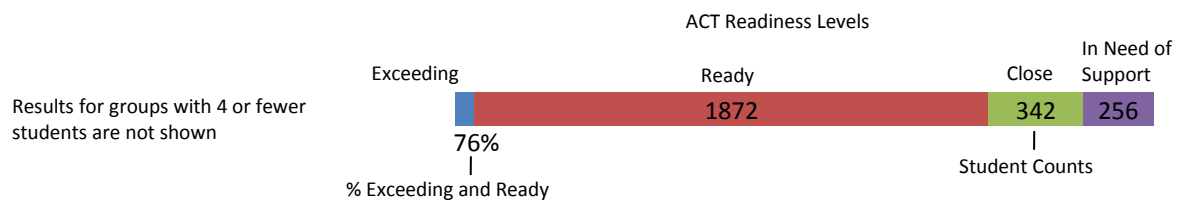

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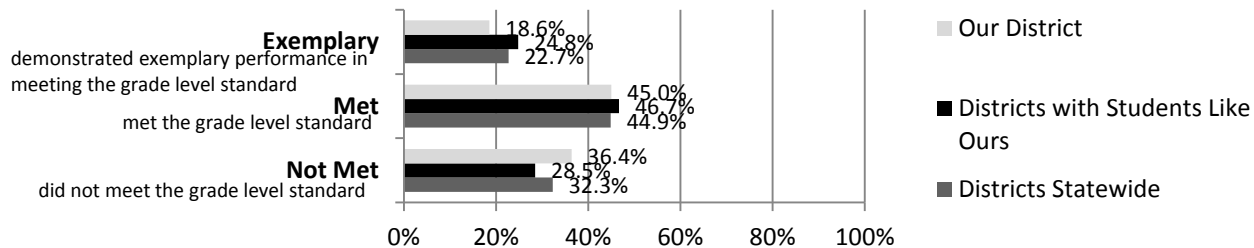
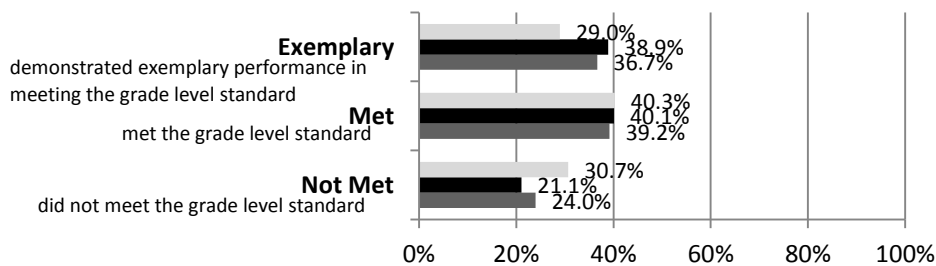

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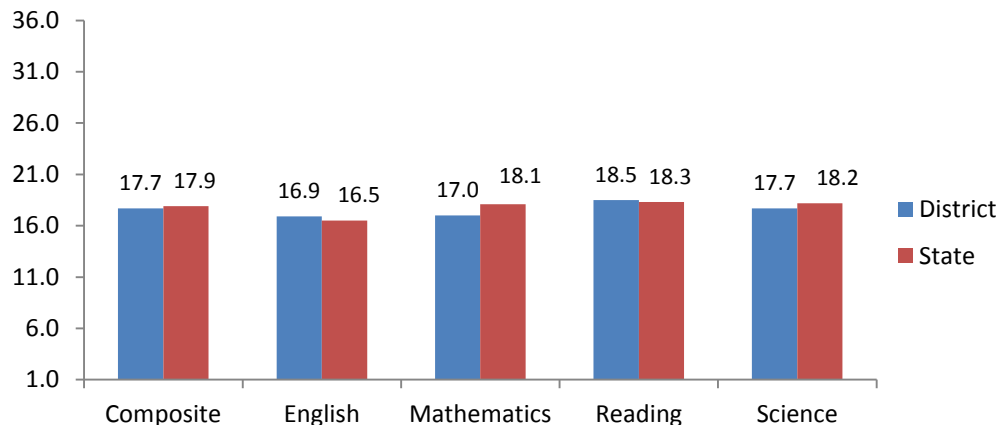

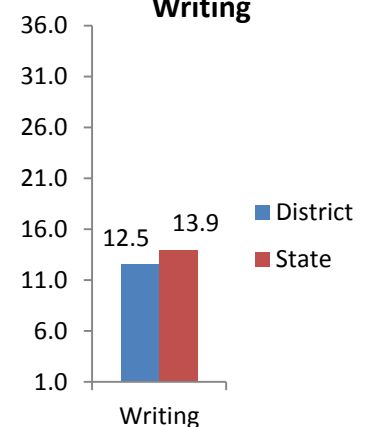
Districts with Students Like Ours are districts with poverty indices of no more than 5% above or below the index for the district.

The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.

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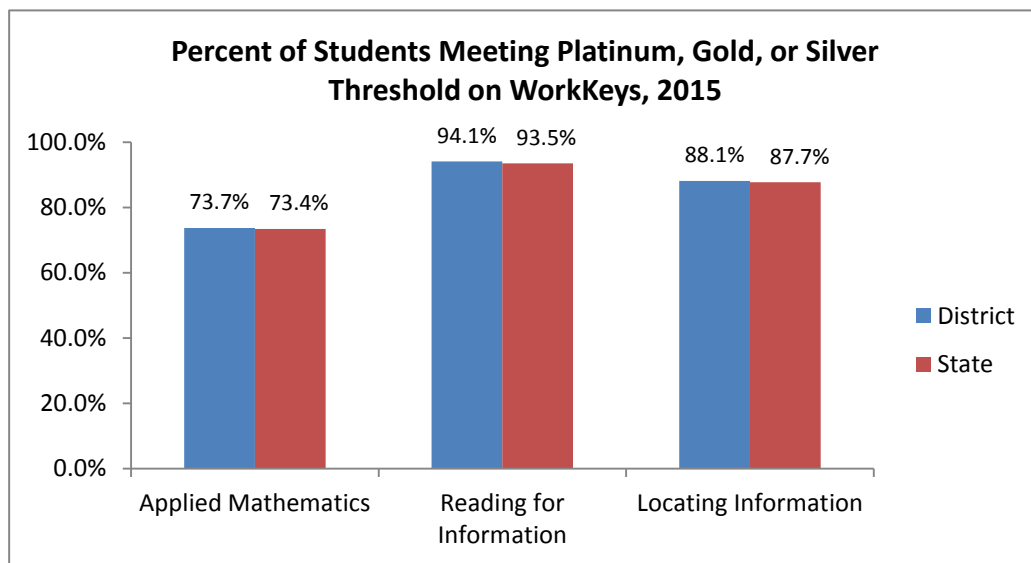
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KNOWLEDGE

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
