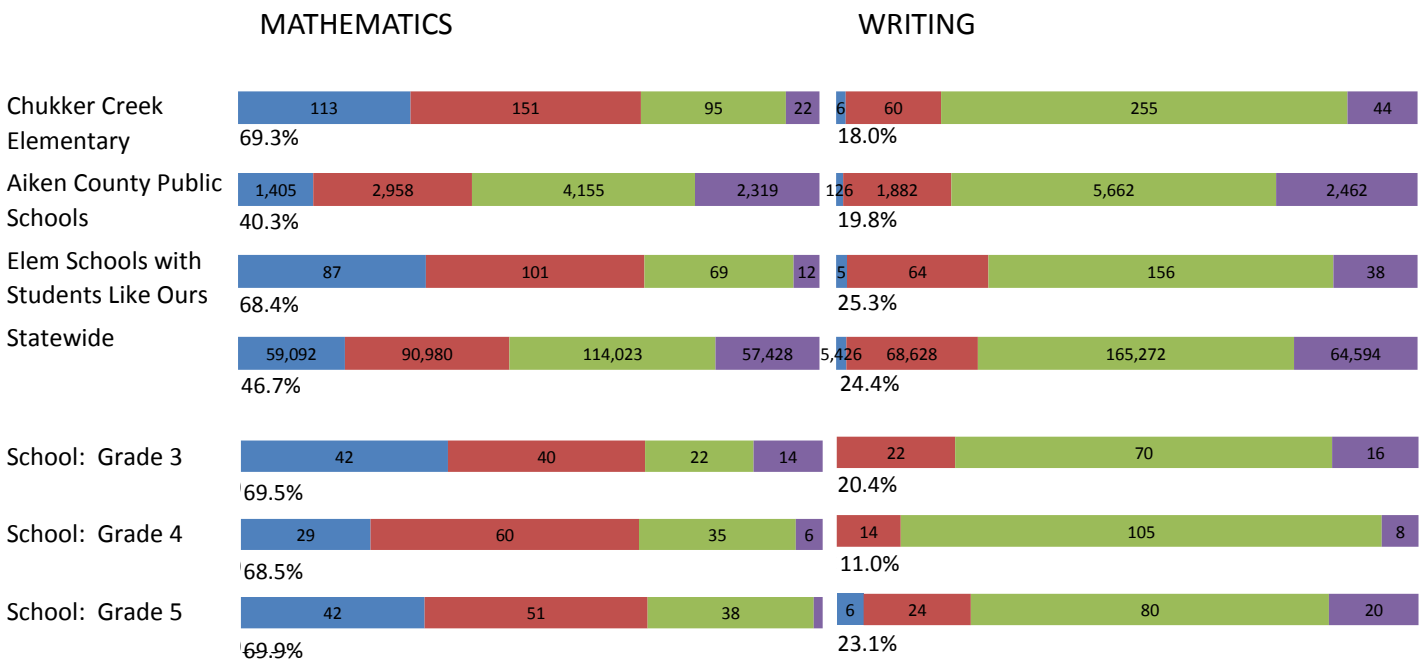

We provide such an environment through the implementation of our school purpose. The purpose of CCE is to engage students in a rigorous, developmentally appropriate curriculum that fosters confident and inquisitive lifelong learners with positive citizenship characteristics. We demonstrate this purpose by partnering with parents and the community to enhance learning opportunities for all students. The faculty and staff work collaboratively with parents and the community to develop responsible, productive citizens of strong character. At Chukker Creek Elementary, teachers provide research based interventions to effectively meet academic and social goals. These goals are developed based on analyzing a variety of assessments. Teachers use a wide variety of teaching methods and developmentally appropriate practices to provide an instructional program that will help each student reach their full potential. Collaborating with all major stakeholders plays an important role in meeting the needs of our students. Teachers collaborate with administration to analyze data and plan for a variety of instructional methods. The first Wednesday of each month is designated as an early release day for students. Teachers spend time in staff development programs for support and training on Formative Assessment and Professional Learning Communities. Our faculty, PTO Board, and School Improvement Council (SIC) work diligently on achieving the goals set forth in our five year strategic plan. At Chukker Creek, we also have various programs that focus on the development of the whole child. These programs support the physical, social, emotional and intellectual development of our students. Our character education program continues to expand through the recognition of safety patrol, office helpers, and positive behavior incentives. Running Club, Chorus, and Dance Crew are a few of the opportunities that allow students to display their many talents. Our guidance counselor meets with Student Ambassadors monthly to develop leaders in our school as well as K-Kids who serve various organizations in our community. At Chukker Creek, we believe the school, family, and community all play a major role in shaping the lives of our youth. Together, we are developing our future South Carolina graduates and world class leaders.

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



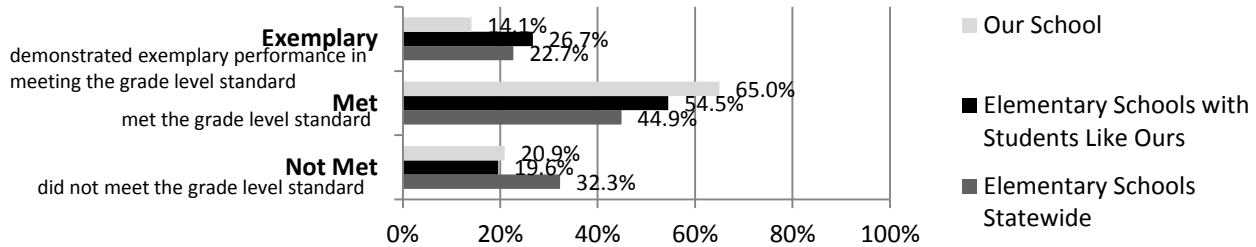

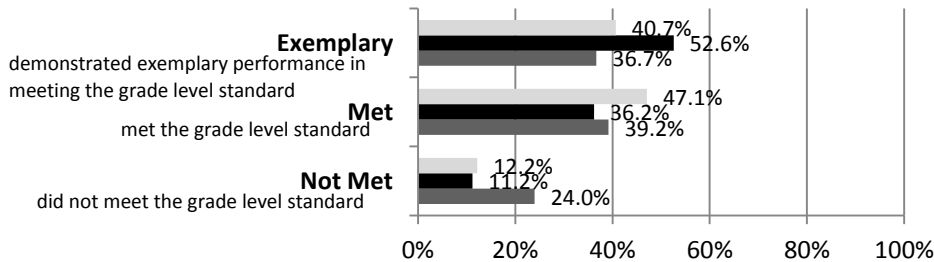
