
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

The faculty and staff at Starr Elementary are dedicated to helping all students meet and exceed their individual abilities and help them develop to their fullest potential to become career and college readiness. Starr Elementary added two all day K4 classes. Our total enrollment with the two additional classes was 504 students in K4 through fifth grade during the 2014-2015 school year. All grade levels at Starr Elementary hold students accountable for mastering the state standards and striving for excellence as they are emerged with character traits including integrity, self-direction, perseverance, strong work ethics and interpersonal skills to help them in all facets of life. Starr Elementary hosted a district Jet Toy competition. The first and second place teams competed in the regional competition in Clemson, S.C. Our group of three fifth graders finished third in the regional competition. Our students have to use their creativity and innovation to build their cars. It takes teamwork and collaboration from each team member to problem solve and use critical thinking skills to design ways the car will move the best in competition for each category. The curriculum at Starr Elementary is data driven. CASE Benchmark tests are given three times a year to help our staff better identify students' strengths and needs of the curriculum. Benchmark assessments are given to find to each child's reading level. The data driven instruction allows teachers to better meet the needs of each individual student. Again this year, Starr received the Palmetto Silver Incentive Award from the South Carolina Department of Education. Starr is fortunate to have active involvement and teamwork of our faculty and staff, PTO members, parents, and community members. This strong support helps foster the relationship between the school, home, and community. Many parents and community members volunteered numerous hours giving of their time, energy, and support to help Starr shine bright in all areas. Our kindergarten teacher, Sharon Harbin, was selected by the faculty as our Teacher of the Year. Starr Elementary strives to personally touch the lives of each student. Together with our parents and community, we are dedicated to providing our students with exciting and motivating learning experiences that will make a positive impact on each child preparing them with the lifelong world class skills to compete in the career world and life.




