

We provide such an environment through the implementation of our school vision: a school that focuses on "Whatever It Takes!" We demonstrate this vision by challenging our students with best practices to reach their full potential and by the continuous professional development of our teachers. Our teachers are always seeking to learn new and effective strategies to use in the classroom such as Daily Five and CAFE, Guided Reading, Guided Math, science kits and labs, Accelerated Reader, computerized individualized instruction through "Classworks", integration of literature and writing into all content and related arts, and ELA Balanced Literacy. We are proud that all of our students are showing growth and we are indicating a steady trend of academic achievement in all areas. At Flat Rock Elementary School we serve our students and community through various programs in and outside the academic world to focus on the development of the whole child. School-wide we have focused on embedding character education in all programs and using the program of CORE Essentials Character Education. We continue to use facets of the Positive Behavior Interventions and Support program(PBIS). This is supported by monthly celebrations through our Terrific Kid and school attendance recognitions. We have a formal business partnership with Michelin. These activities include weekly tutoring sessions, lunch buddies, mentoring, student tours of the plant, and purchased supplies. Our school has also partnered with local faith based organizations to provide afterschool programs such as Good News and YMCA. United Way sponsors our Back Pack Snack Pack program to provide food over the week end for numerous needy students. We continue to offer Breakfast in the Classroom to ensure that all have a healthy breakfast. We celebrate all children through our Diversity Day. Other programs are savings and finance class sessions through our business partner Upstate Federal Credit Union, "Tar Wars", and the South Carolina Reads Book program. At Flat Rock Elementary we believe the school, family, and community must share the educational responsibility of our young. We hold to our vision of "Whatever It Takes!" 


## KNOWLEDGE
