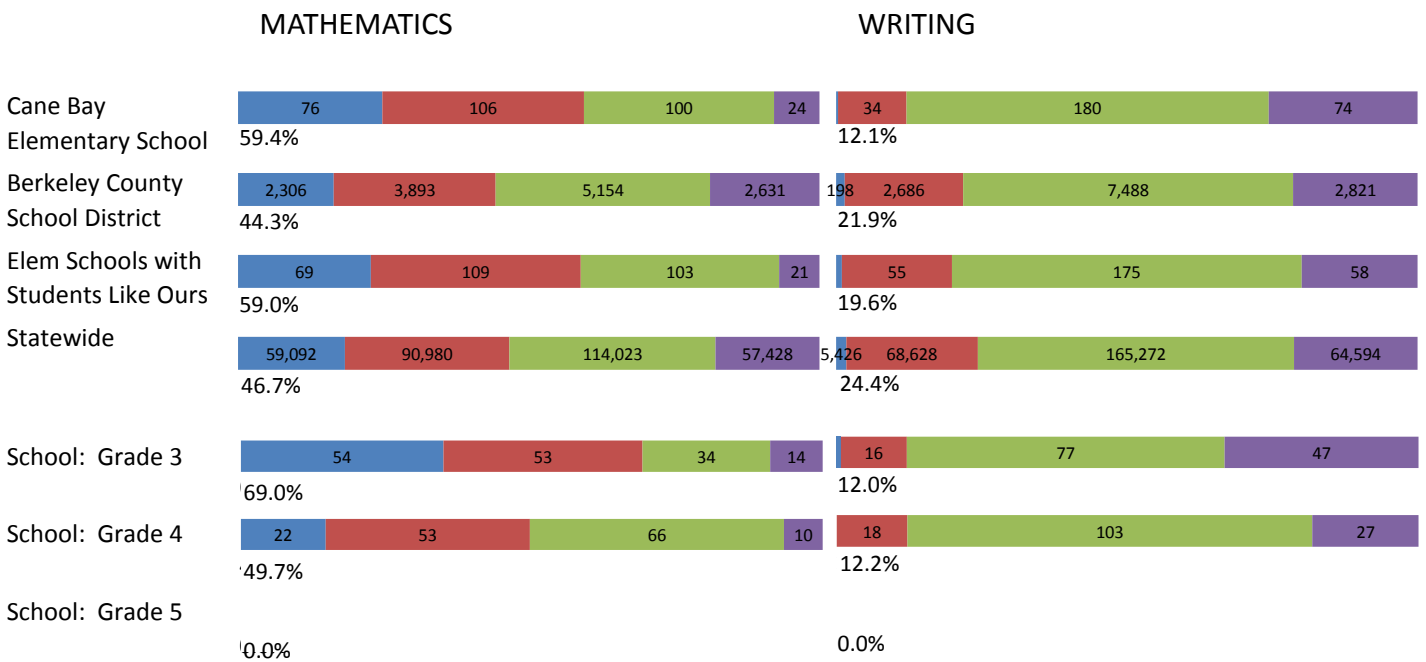
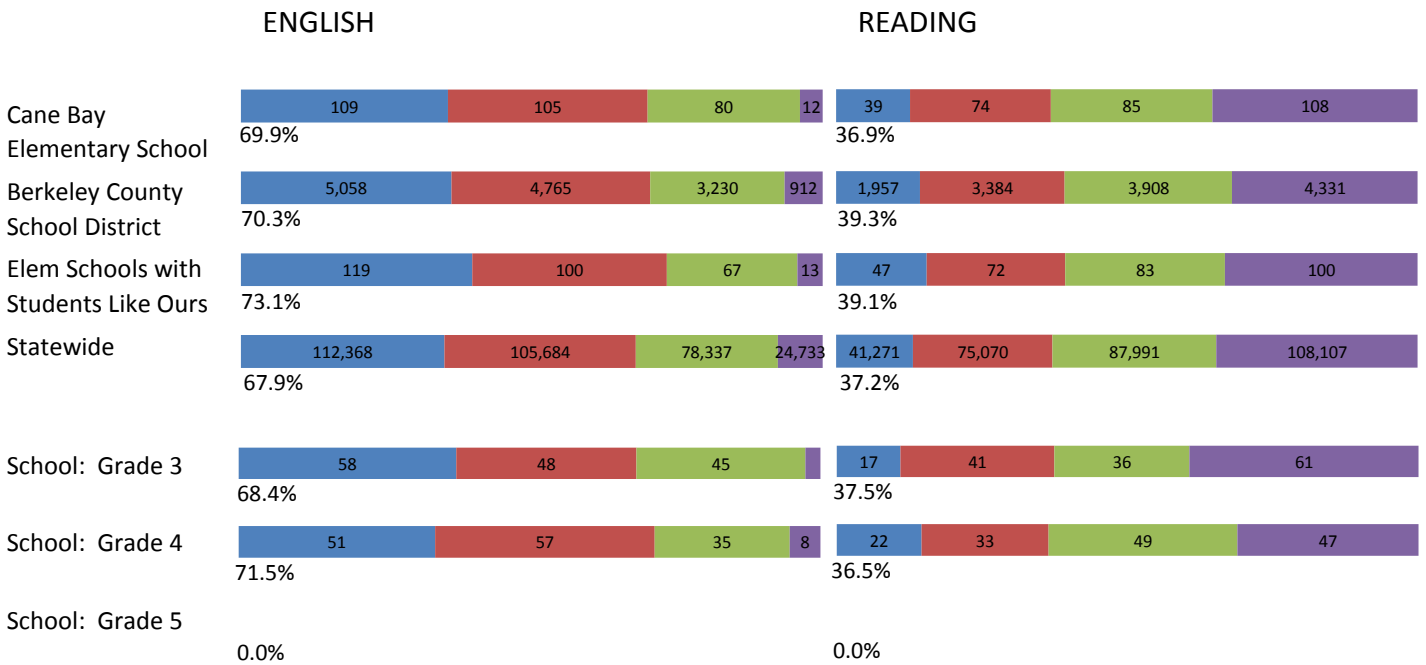
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Cane Bay Elementary is helping all students develop world class skills and life and career characteristics by committing to provide students with dynamic instruction and ignite a passion for life-long learning. The expertise of the instructional staff has provided students with the support necessary to empower them to be successful in a highly competitive world. We realize high levels of academic growth and achievement for all students by providing a safe, student-centered, positive learning environment. World class knowledge will be gained as students participate in curriculum units aligned to standards and include critical thinking and problem solving activities. Multiple teachers have worked to increase their understanding of instruction by participating in a Math Teacher Leader program that focuses on the eight mathematical practices. Staff members strive for excellence through the implementation of standards-driven instruction. All teachers participate in Professional Learning Communities as a way to increase content knowledge, improve professionally, and collaborate regarding strategies and best practices that will improve student achievement. World class skills are gained through multiple school activities and programs. All students participate in a Multi-Tiered Support System that provides at-risk students with remedial instruction and accelerates the skills of advanced students. Technology integration is a goal and currently all fourth grade students have 1:1 devices and other classrooms in the school have small group sets of tablets. School-wide reading strategies are utilized as a way to encourage and support students as readers as they develop the skills necessary for life beyond graduation. Life and career characteristics are strengthened through our career day activities and quarterly award recognitions. Our students participate in community programs that develop and promote citizenship. The Kiwanis "Terrific Kids" character education program and the Kids Who Care environmental awareness program both help students learn the importance of life characteristics. Students have opportunities to develop healthy habits through Boosterthon, Cardio Cubs, and Jump Rope for Heart fitness activities. In addition to school-wide and individual student academic success, students are recognized for their behavior through the school's Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports program. At Cane Bay Elementary we strive for excellence and believe all students will be successful, world class leaders upon leaving our schools as graduates.

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



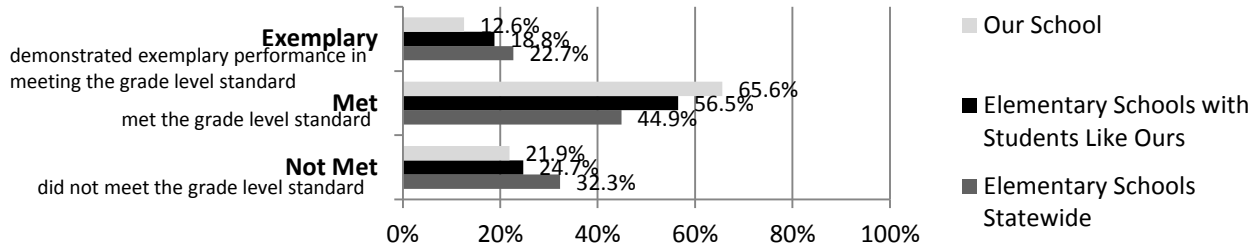

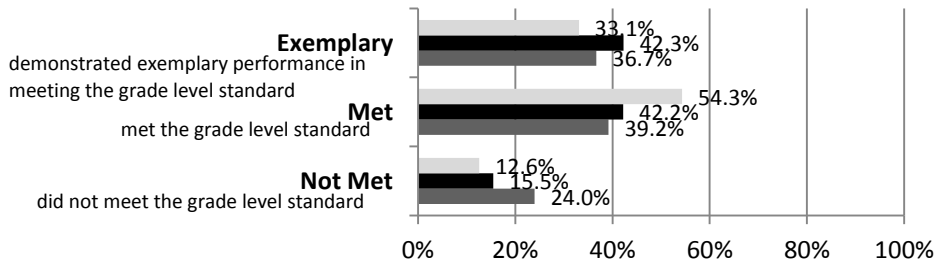
