Orange Grove Charter School is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the SC Graduate by using the autonomy allowed with our charter status to provide an instructional program that is rigorous and data driven, with a focus on standards and achievement. We are a National Blue Ribbon and Palmetto's Finest School, serving the students of Charleston for 51 years, the last 9 years as a conversion charter school. With our charter status, we can be fiscally conservative, thus giving us the ability to offer small class sizes, Spanish instruction, Academic Specialists at each grade level, bus transportation, and the latest technology. In August 2015, we built upon our success and added a 6th grade on a separate campus; we will continue to grow one grade level each year until we serve grades CD-8.

Our students consistently excel on state and national assessments. Forty five percent of our 3rd - 5th graders have been identified as academically gifted and talented, a 15% increase over the previous year. Nearly 80% of our teachers have advanced degrees and 12 have National Board Certification. We consistently receive state recognition for our academic accomplishments. Our 2014 Excellent State report card rating was our 5th consecutive such rating. We received a Palmetto Gold Award for closing the achievement gap and earned the highest 2014 ESEA grade in all of District 10.

We have over 20 business partners and a PTO that cannot be matched. Each year they help sponsor an Artist in Residence program that gives students hands-on instruction in the visual and performing arts. Extracurricular activities include: Honor Society, Student Council, Google Club, mentoring and leadership clubs, Recycling Club, Science Fair, WTMN News Show, Chess Club, Strings, and Chorus. We offer basketball, tennis, golf, soccer club, outdoor adventure club, volleyball, baseball, softball, and sailing. Families enjoy our Fun Run, Pancake Breakfast, Spring Fling, Family Bingo Night, Pro-Kids Show, Silent Auction and the Holiday Shop.

The Orange Grove community is something special. Our families work together to collect canned food for charity and pet food and supplies for local animal shelters and our students help deliver goods to these organizations. Our families and business partners sponsor a Backpack Buddies program to provide food for needy families during weekends and long holiday breaks.

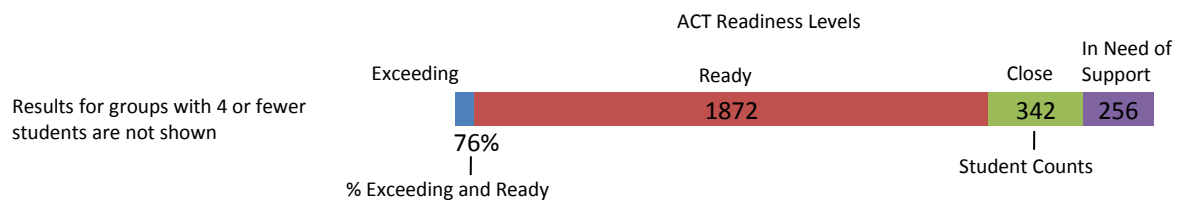
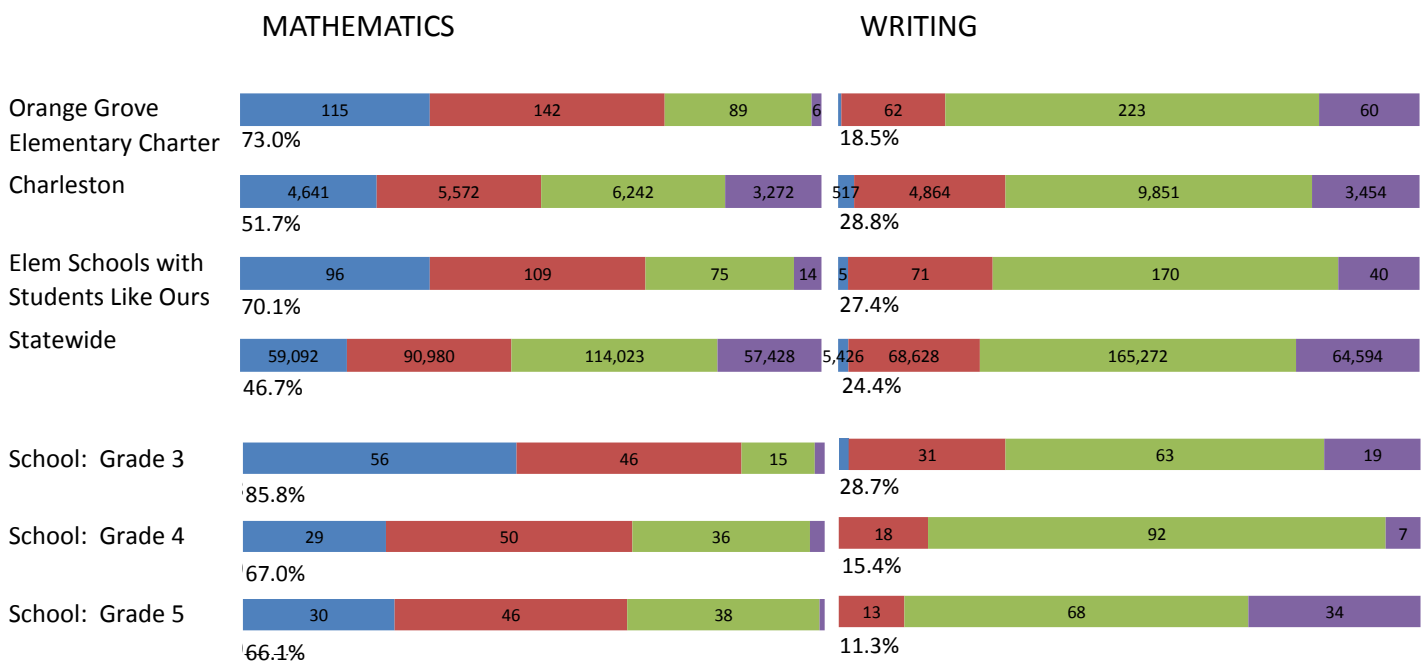
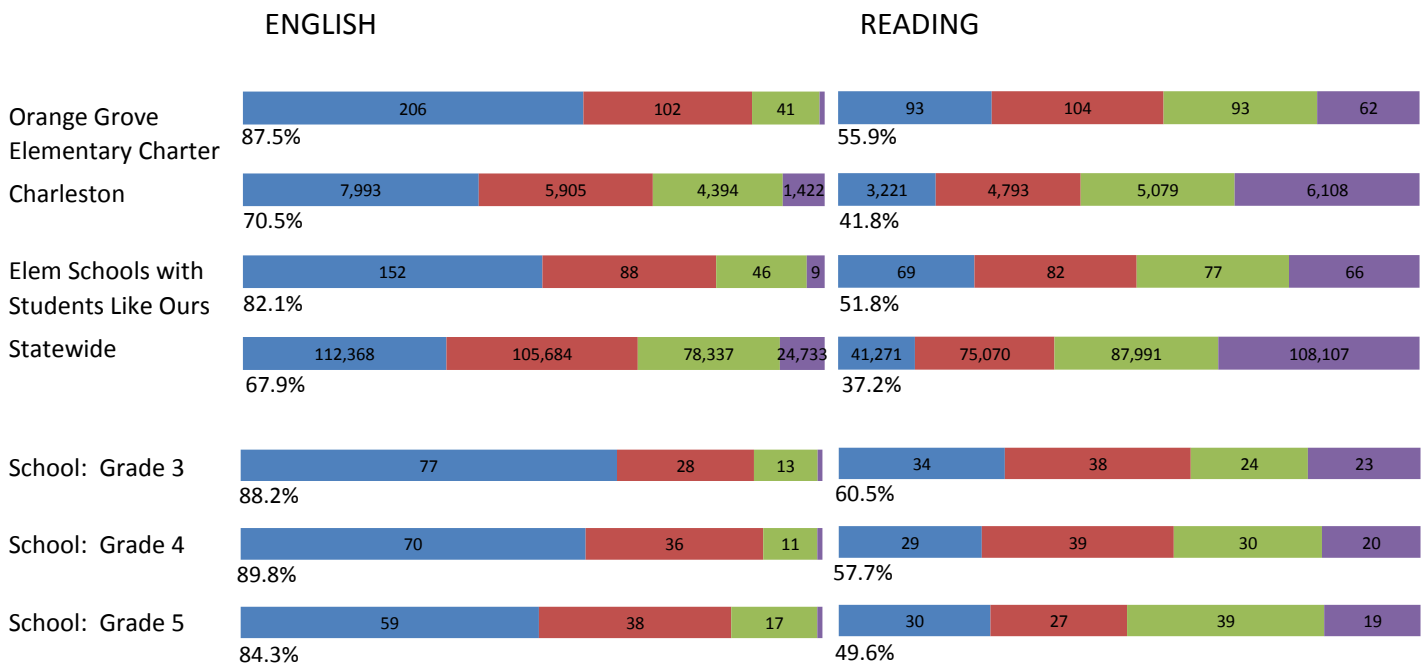
