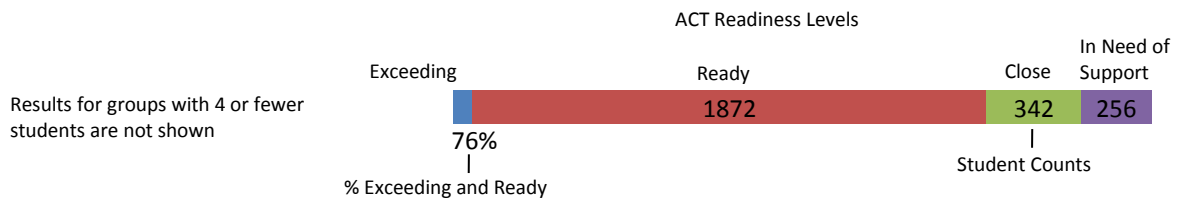
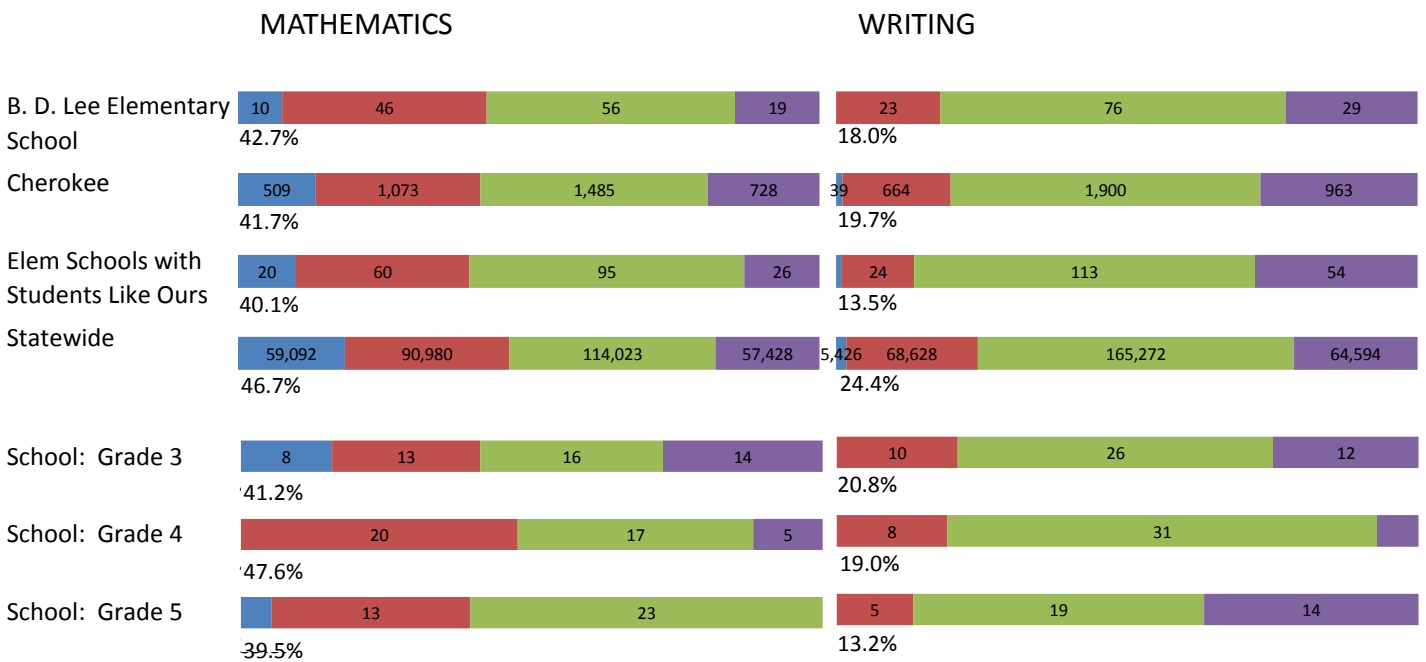
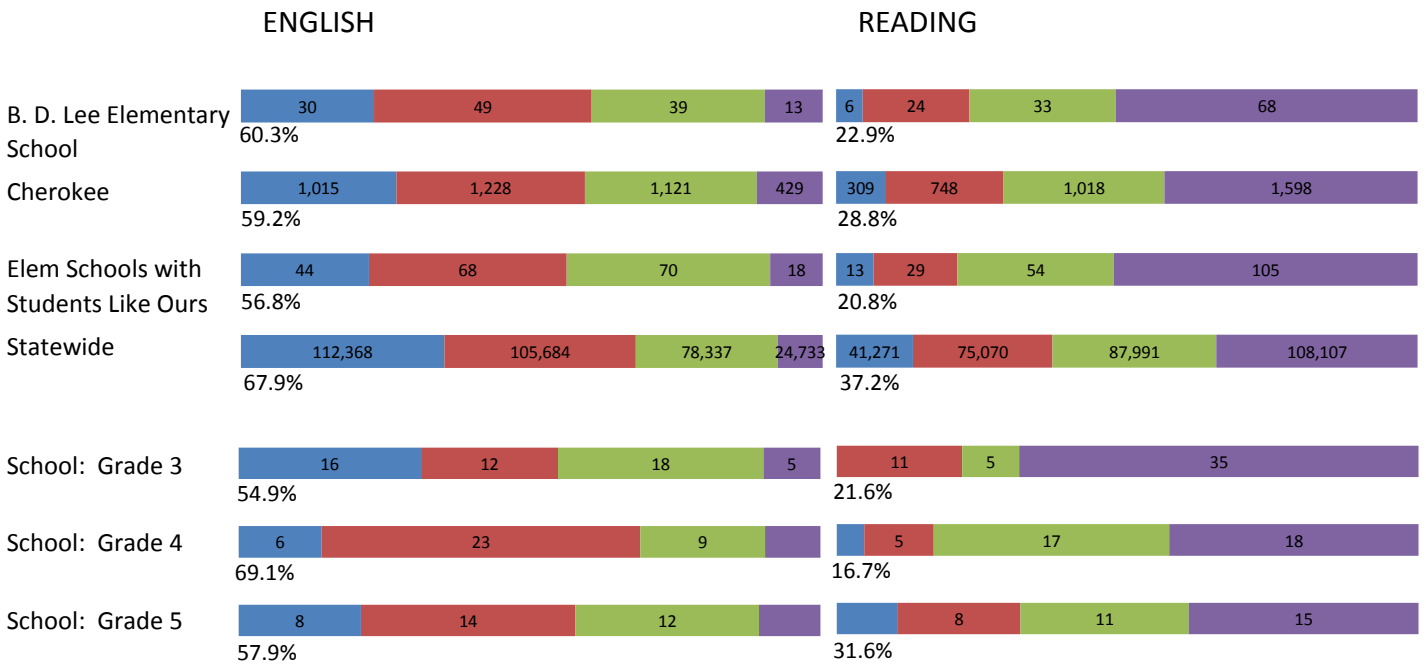

By investing in our children's future, our students are given opportunities to experience success through learning models such as Daily Five, Small Group Differentiation, RtI, Accelerated Reading, Project Goal, STEM, Reading Interventionists and frequent progress and monitoring. At B. D. Lee Elementary School our school's motto is "Believing is Achieving." This motto conveys our beliefs about teaching and learning. In our school, "We believe all students can learn!" and "We believe in providing an excellent education!" As a result, our school increased 15.8 points on the ESEA Waiver allowing our performances to meet the state guidelines. We believe it takes everyone working together in a supportive and positive school climate in order to experience success therefore, this year we continued to use the Positive Behavior Intervention Support System. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



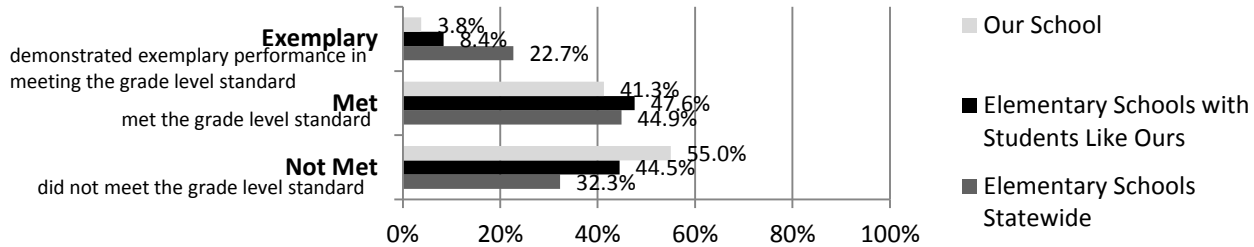

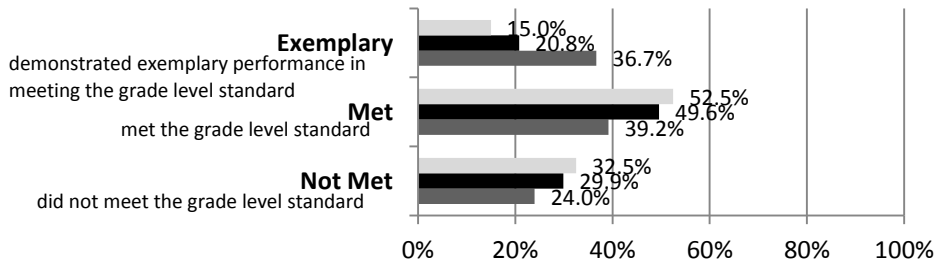
