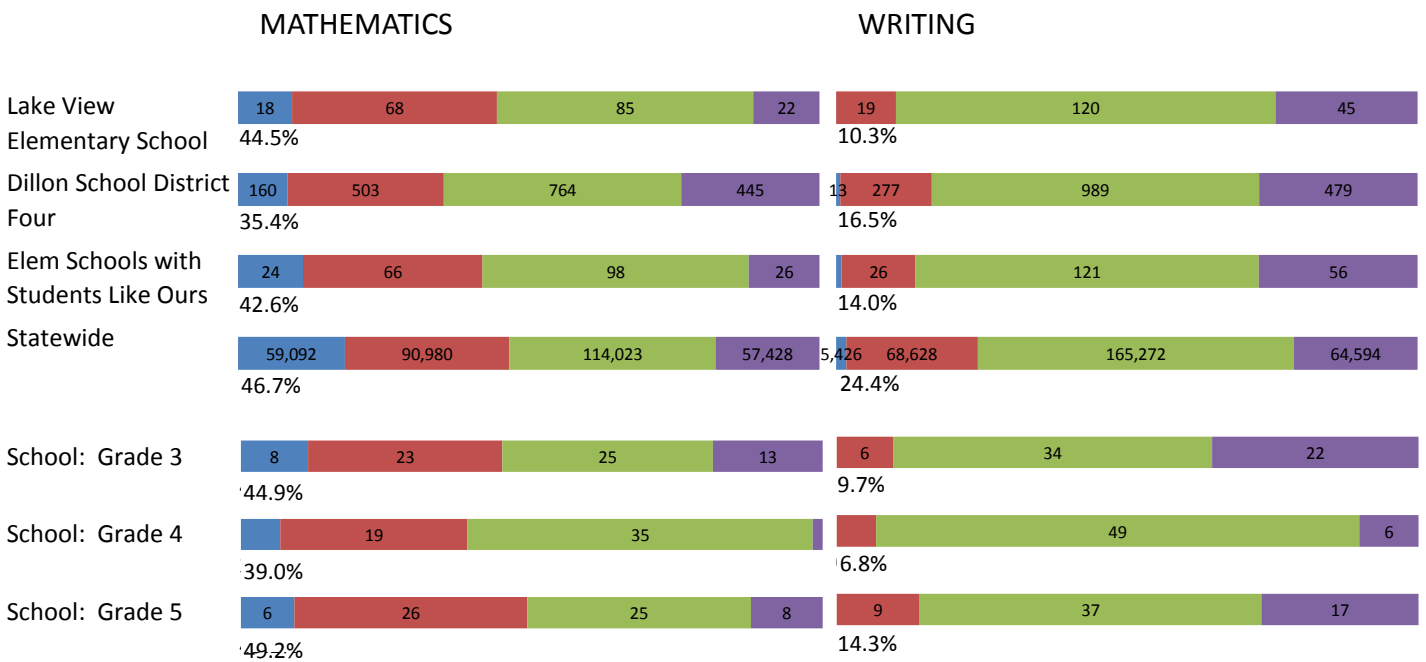
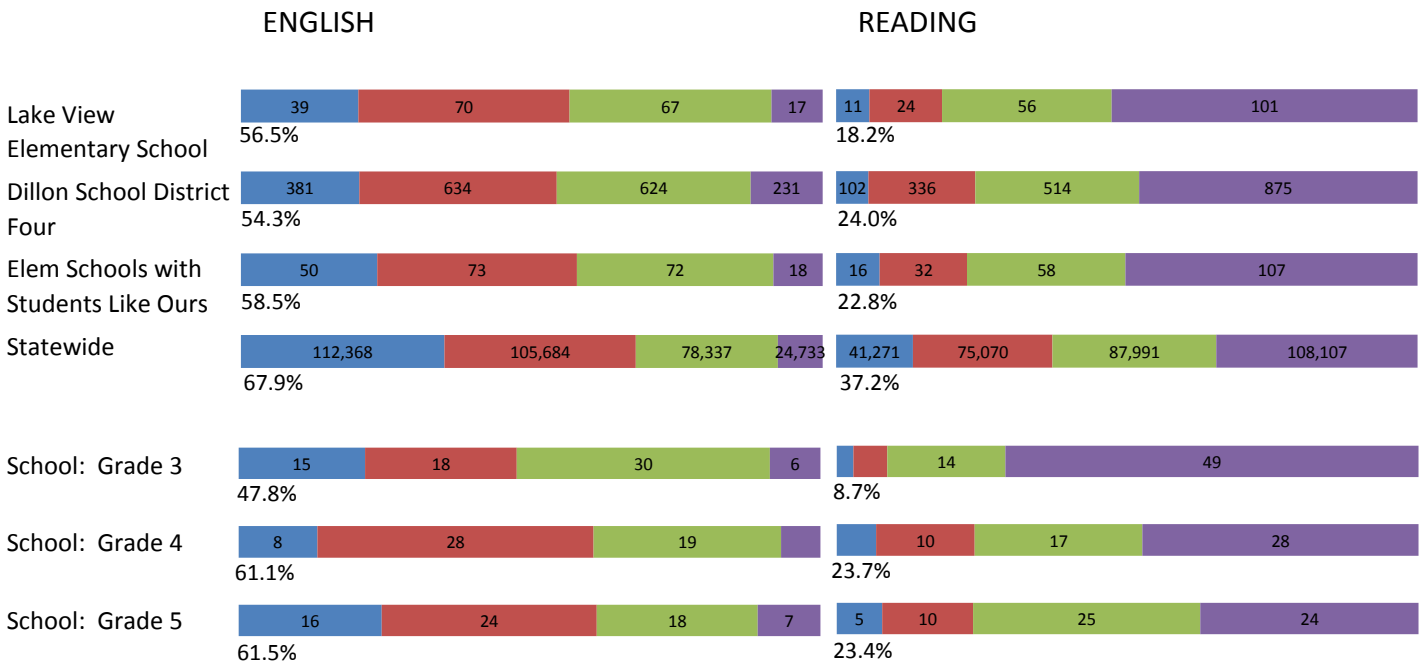
WORLD CLASS SKILLS & LIFE AND CAREER CHARACTERISTICS

These standards transform instruction in the classroom and includes inquiry-based learning opportunities across all content areas. Teachers are facilitating learning in the classroom by providing opportunities for students to use critical thinking and problem solving skills while working collaboratively with their classmates. Students are encouraged to use creative and innovative ideas to interact with the content being taught, to construct knowledge about the world, and to apply their knowledge to real world tasks. At Lake View Elementary, character education is woven throughout every part of our school day. Every morning begins with a positive character message from the school principal. This is followed by classroom community meetings while the students and classroom teacher eat breakfast together. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



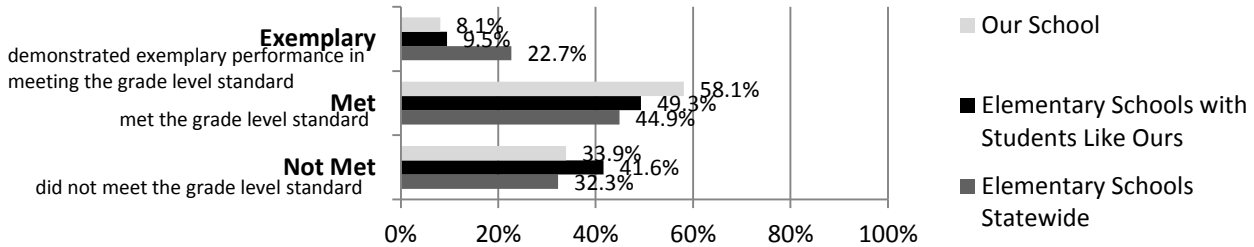

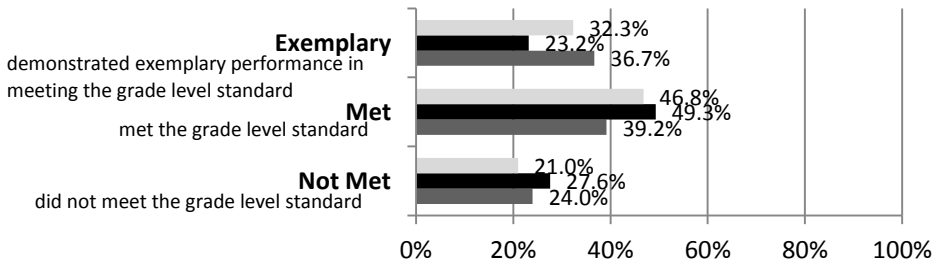
