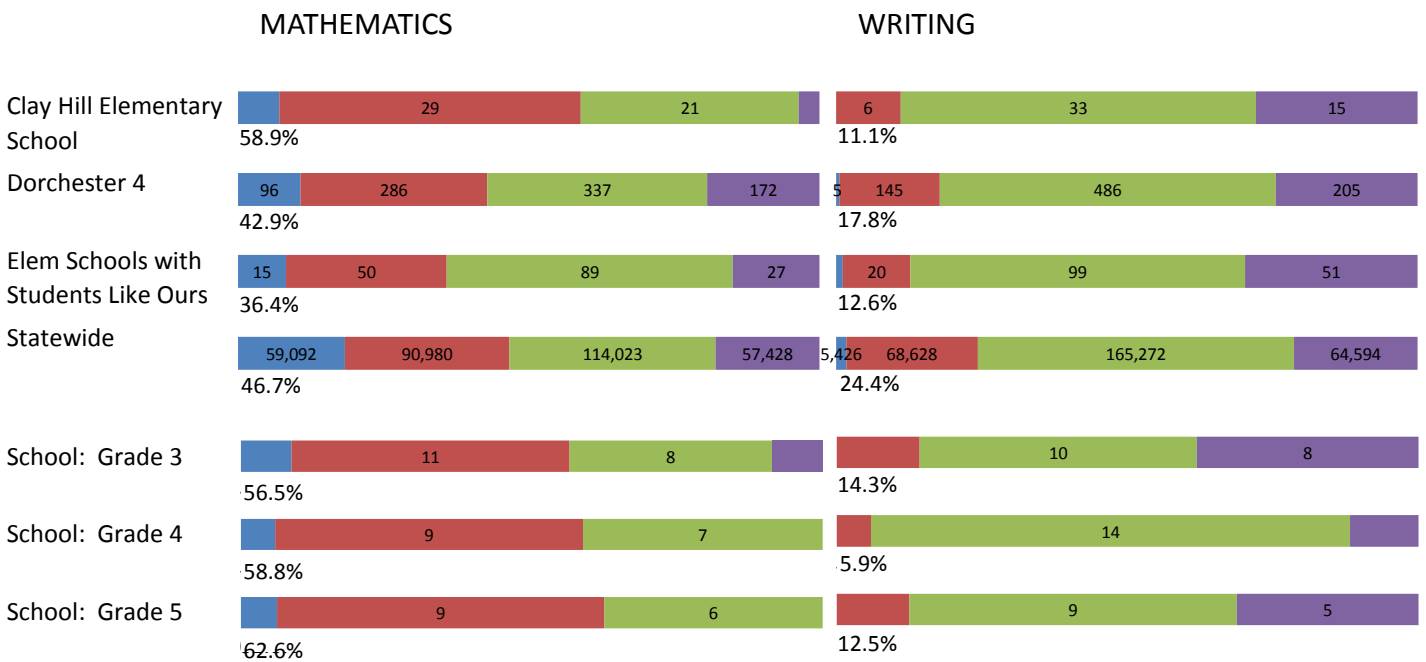
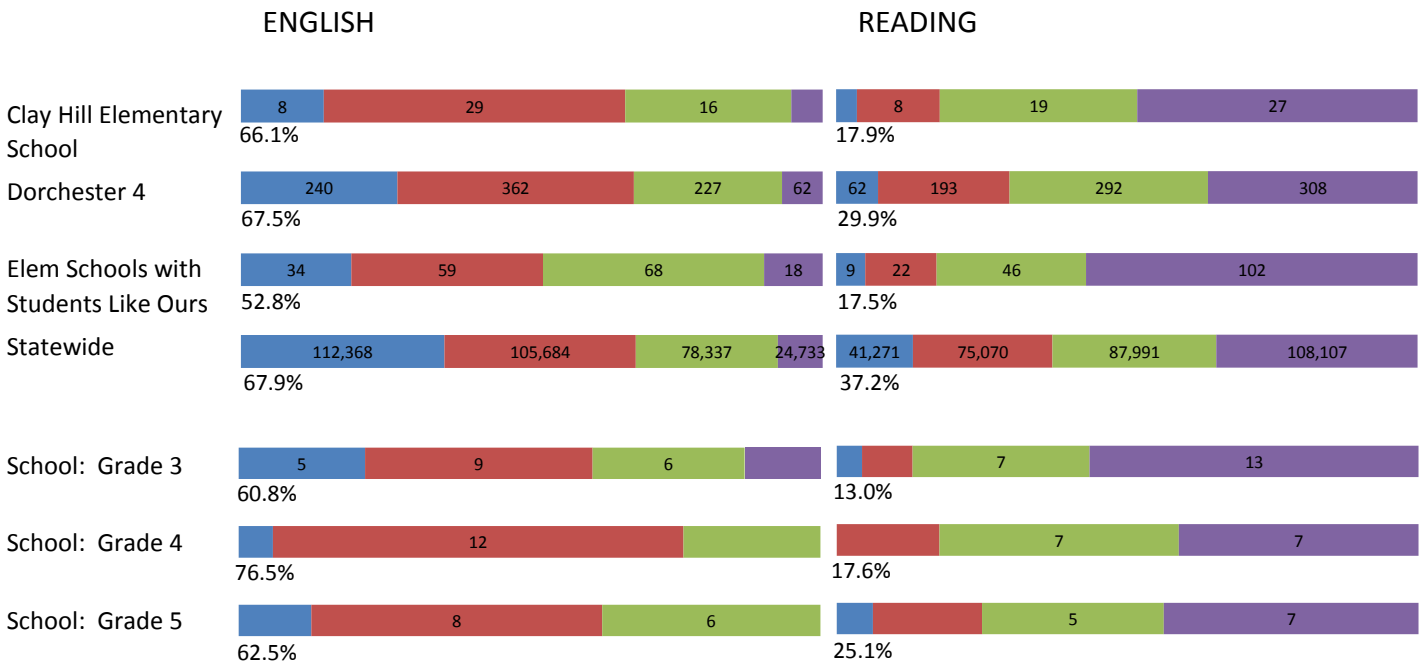
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Our motto, "Collaborating to Help Every Eagle Soar" exemplifies the commitment that we have to working together to meet the needs of each child. To ensure the delivery of quality instruction, all teachers at CHES are highly qualified. Our teacher: student ratio is also low, which provides time for individualized instruction. To promote and sustain academic success, our teachers constantly receive professional development training in order to adopt new and innovative instructional strategies to improve their performance. Programs and strategies such as: reading intervention, math intervention, progress monitoring benchmarks, and 120 minutes of daily uninterrupted reading instruction are used to support the learning process. Additionally, we embed character education lessons throughout school life to help students develop the social and life skills needed to foster the development of the whole child. Beyond the classroom, our students have the opportunity to participate in several clubs and extracurricular activities, which include: After School, Basketball, Softball, Soccer, Cheerleading, etc. As an outreach opportunity, CHES partners with a local church, Ridgeville Baptist, to implement a "Snack Pack Buddies" program which provides nutritious food for disadvantaged students to carry home to eat over the weekend. We also join forces annually with nearby businesses to participate in Day of Caring projects which helps us to build community relations and improve different aspects of our school. 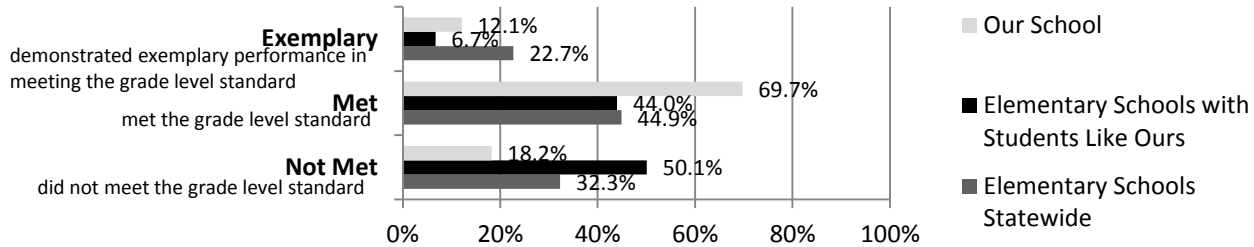

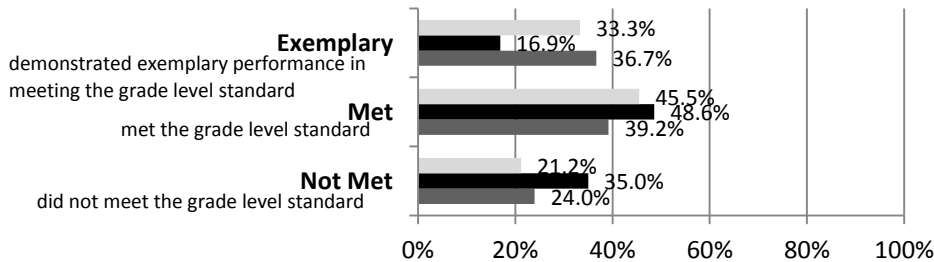
