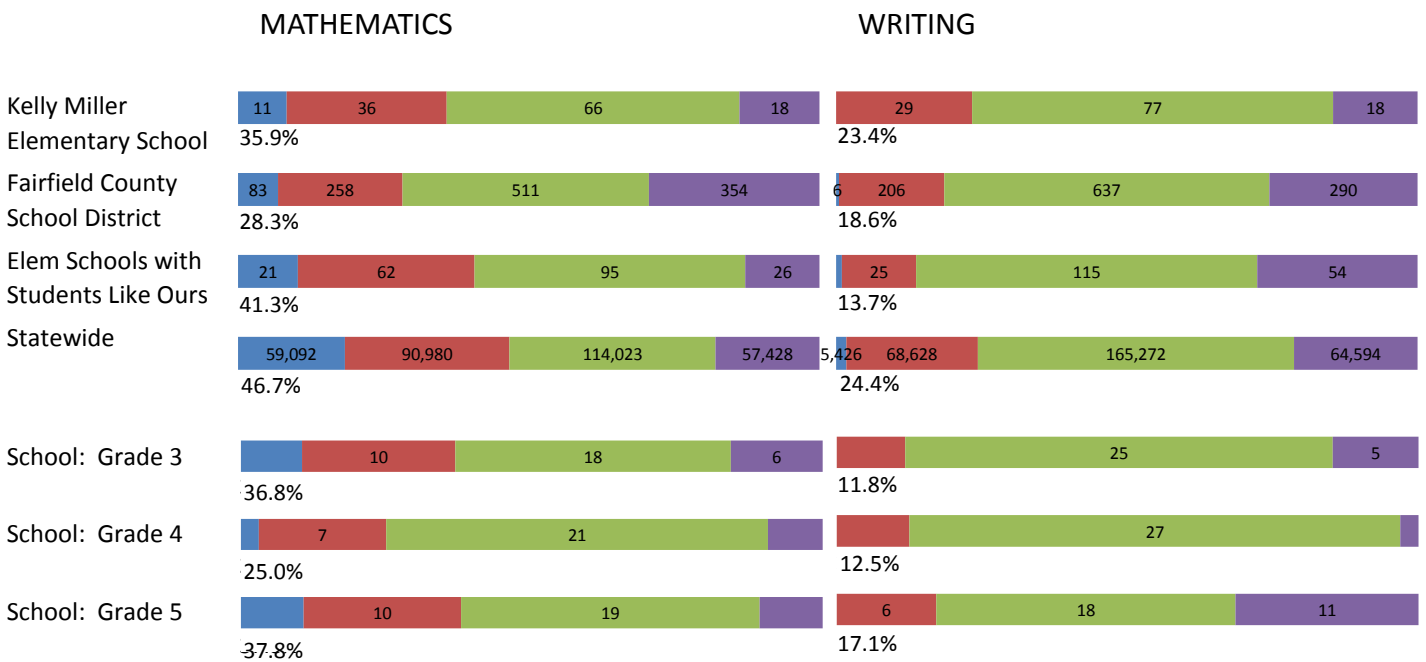
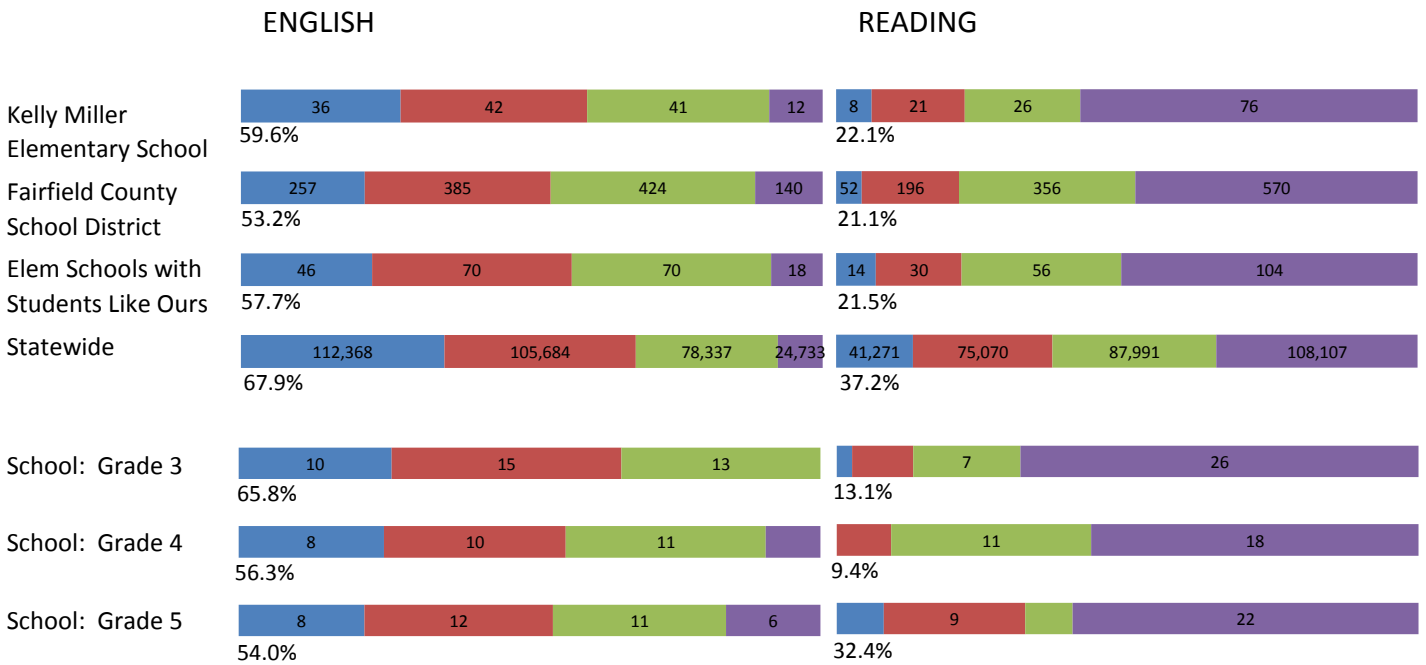
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Kelly Miller Elementary School is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by creating an environment reflective of our school vision and our school creed. KMES challenges students and teachers to utilize the world class skills of critical thinking, collaboration, innovation and communication as well as life and career characteristics such as integrity, perseverance, and a global perspective. Our teachers participate in ongoing professional development in addition to weekly Data Teams, Vertical Articulation, Grade Level and District Cohort meetings. Teachers develop rigorous instruction and utilize STEM learning activities in Language Arts, Math, Science, Technology and Social Studies that provide students with world class knowledge. As part of school and district initiatives, we implement: "Principal and Parent Reading Partnership", "Coffee, Coke, and Conversation with the Principal", Pre-Algebra Enrichment, Math Lab, Push-in Learning for Ultimate Success (P.L.U.S), Kindergarten Intervention, Reading Counts, Vocabulary and Multiplication Bees, Math Night at Bi-Lo, First in Math, multi-cultural diversity activities and celebrations, Project-Based Learning, and one to one technology. Our Royal G.E.M.S. mentoring program provides character development and integrity in addition to focusing on academic achievement. Our school recently received the Arts in the Basic Curriculum Grant from the South Carolina Arts Commission. Integrating the arts has been a focus for our school as reflected by our participation in community events such as Arts Alive Month. Events like our inaugural Arts on the Green evening, our theatrical production of Aladdin and the Tiger Beatz Marching Band appearances allow our students to interact with the community and develop their self-direction, teamwork, interpersonal skills, work ethic, creativity, and technology skills. We believe that the continued integration of academics and the arts will contribute significantly to our children's intellectual and social development. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



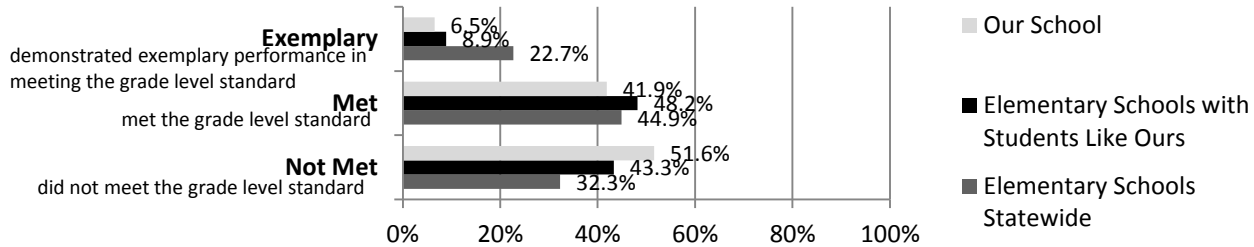

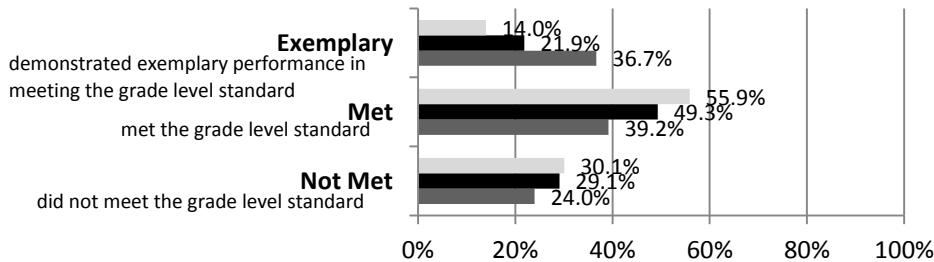
