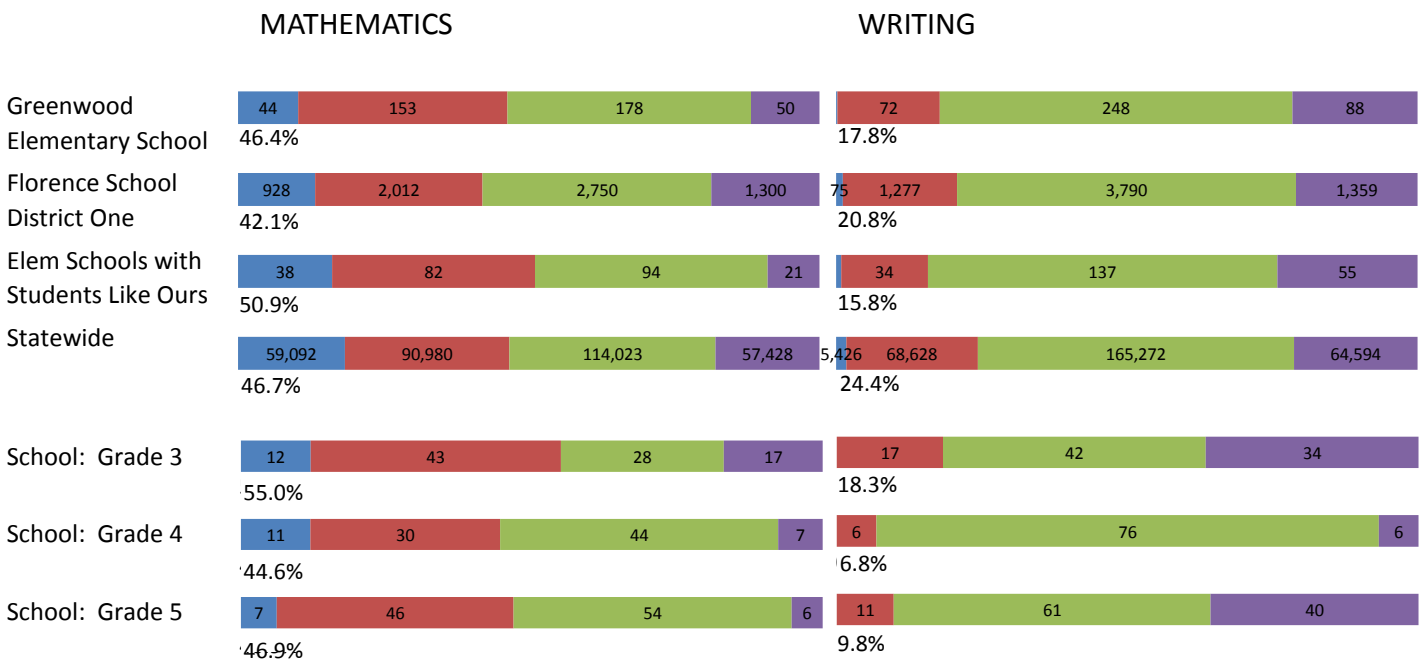
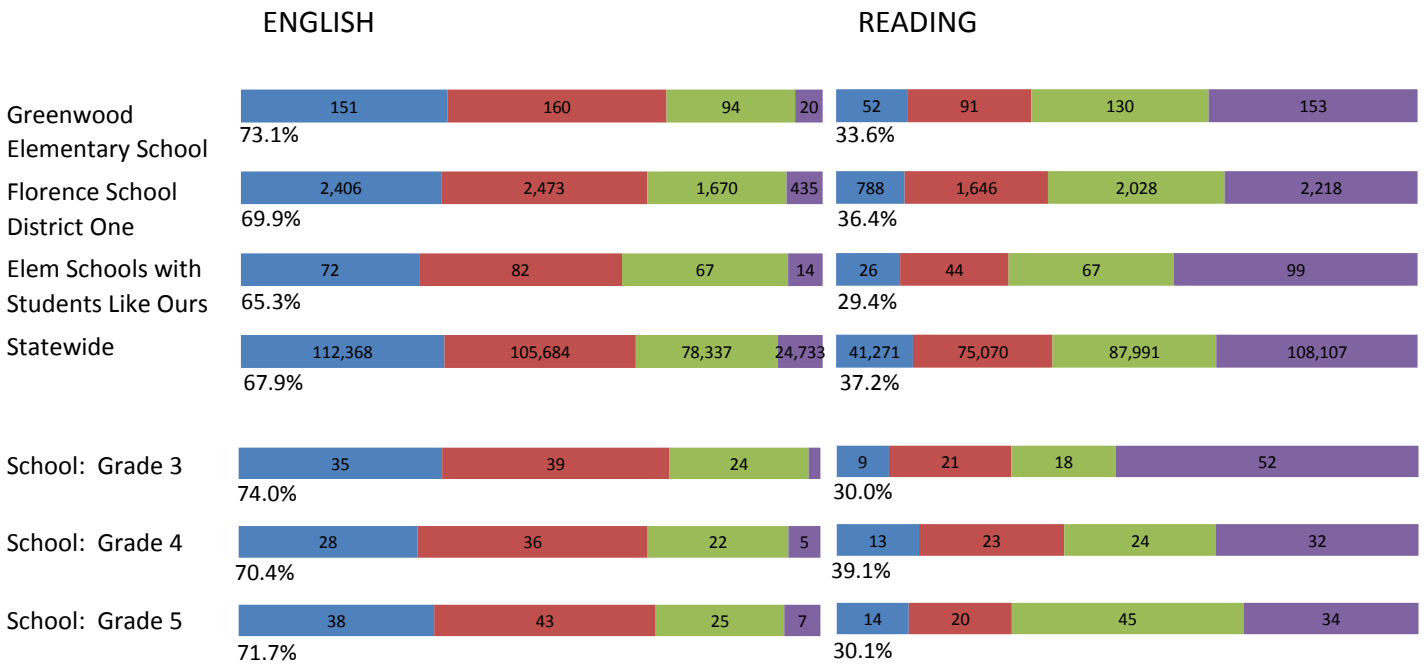

Greenwood Elementary School is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by maintaining high expectations and our commitment to help students reach their greatest potential. The faculty, staff, parents, and community remain steadfast in their support and encouragement of students in setting and achieving goals – academic and extracurricular. Exceptional features that ensure Greenwood is a great place to learn include effective strategies and programs such as: Reading and Math Interventionists, Reading Recovery, Reading Renaissance, Café, Writer’s Workshop, Every Day Math and a hands-on science program. GES students have access to two full-time computer labs and mobile wireless laptop and iPad labs. As a result, Greenwood is proud to be a five time recipient of the Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards for Achievement based on overall performance and progress in closing the achievement gap as well as having the distinction of being recognized as a Title I Reward School for Performance. Extra-curricular activities students participate in include the National BETA Club, GES Safety Patrols, WGES Morning Show, Chorus, Band, Strings, Cheer Squads, Step Team, Good News Club, Speed Cup Stacking Club and Monthly Skate Nights. Greenwood students develop social responsibility by participating in various school wide giving campaigns. This year our students raised over \$10,000 during our Jump Rope for Heart Campaign for the American Heart Association, participated in the Wreaths across America program honoring veterans, collected and distributed canned goods to a community shelter and demonstrated their concern for their peers by providing warm accessories for the winter as part of our Hat and Mitten Giving Tree. We believe the combined efforts of students, parents, community, faculty and staff is needed to educate and prepare our students for the wins and challenges of tomorrow. Our partnership with the National Network of Partnership Schools, our Association of Parents and Teachers, our Faith-Based Mentoring Program, our All Pro Dads Program and our School Improvement Council exemplify this belief. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



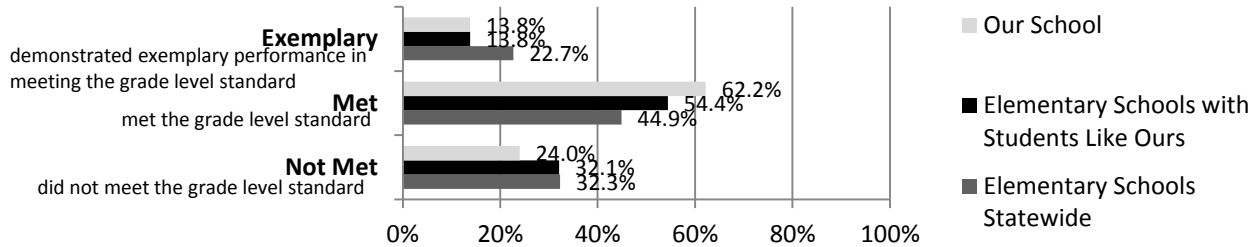

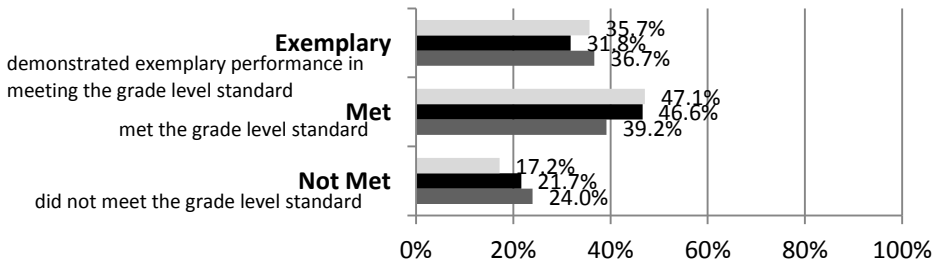
