We set high expectations by providing a challenging and supportive learning environment based on best practices and continuous improvement for our teachers through on-going professional development. The 2015-16 theme was Mission Possible: In Pursuit of Excellence. Our teachers and administration continue to research and utilize best practices in teaching such as: Imagine it!, Every Day Math, science kits, Compass Odyssey, Achieve 3000, ALEKs Math, small group instruction, and reading interventions. Professional development is scheduled throughout the school year to analyze assessment data. Teachers meet with the principal and the Data Team to determine patterns and trends of student strengths and weaknesses and to reflect on instruction. Teachers also meet weekly by grade-level for common planning. In addition, instructional coaches facilitate four hours of monthly grade-level staff development. Professional Learning Communities continuously monitor student achievement and discuss instructional strategies that produce high yield results. At Socastee Elementary, we work to foster the development of the whole child by embedding and promoting life skills throughout our school community. We have high expectations for our students to be good citizens and emphasize quality citizenship. We firmly believe that our students should be prepared to be successful adults who contribute to the world with passion and integrity. We've implemented school-wide expectations in conjunction with our life skills program. Our Shark Pride Award program recognizes students monthly for displaying positive behavior and life skills throughout our school. At Socastee Elementary, we passionately believe in building strong, positive relationships with our students, staff, parents and community by working together through on-going collaboration in order to promote the highest level of success for each student. 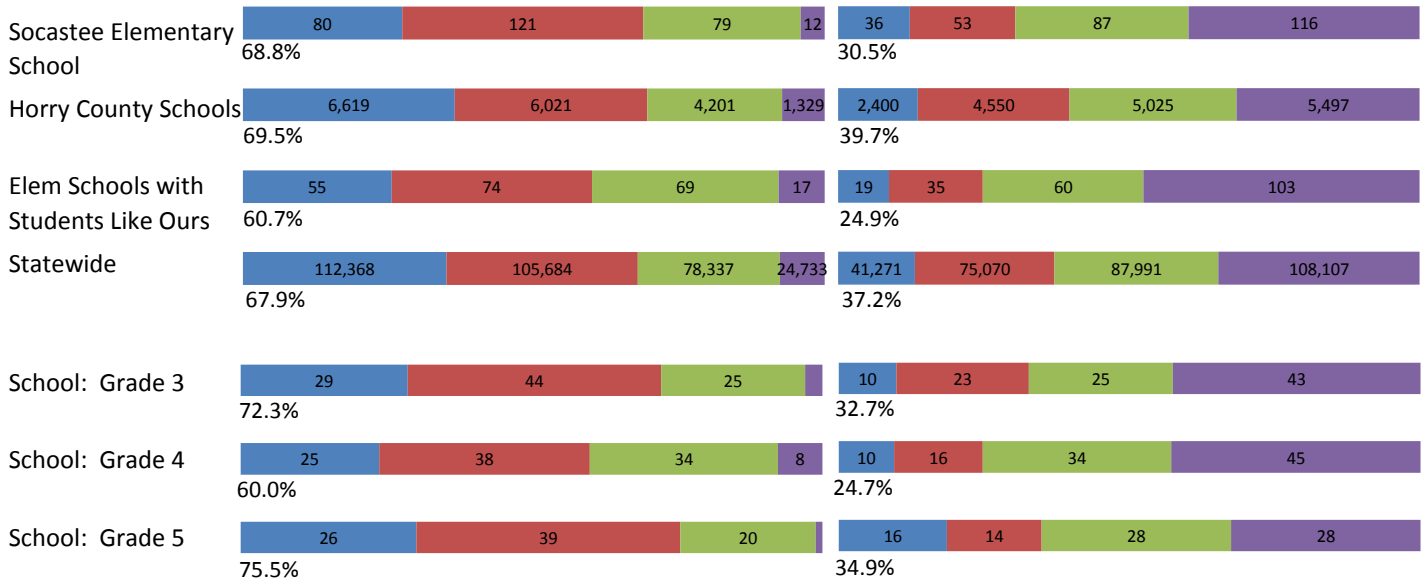

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing

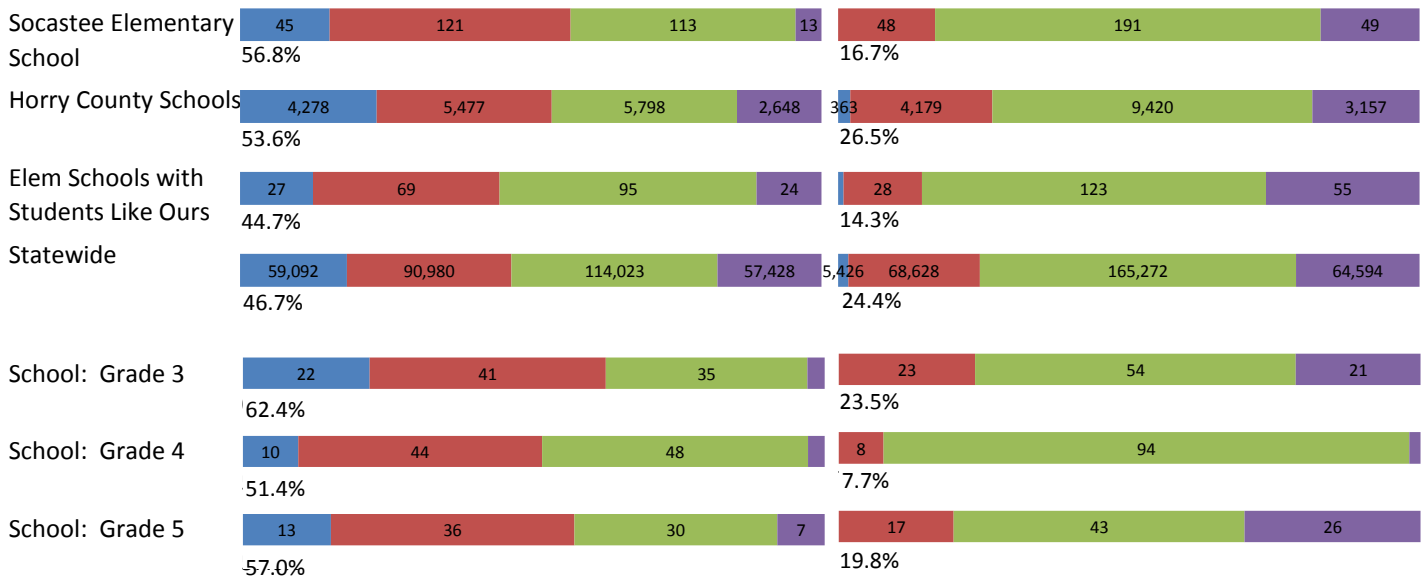

ACT Readiness Levels



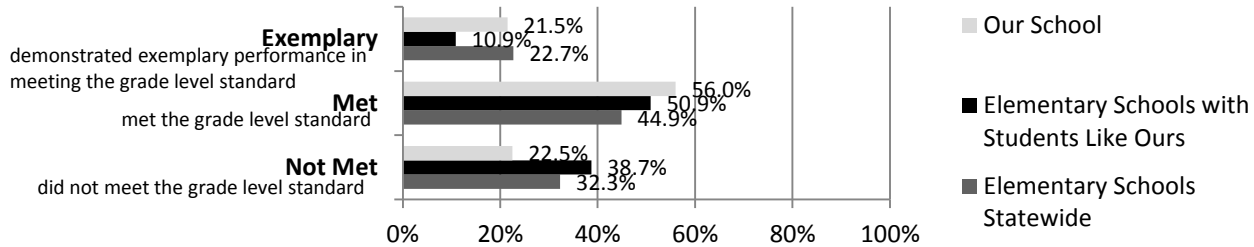

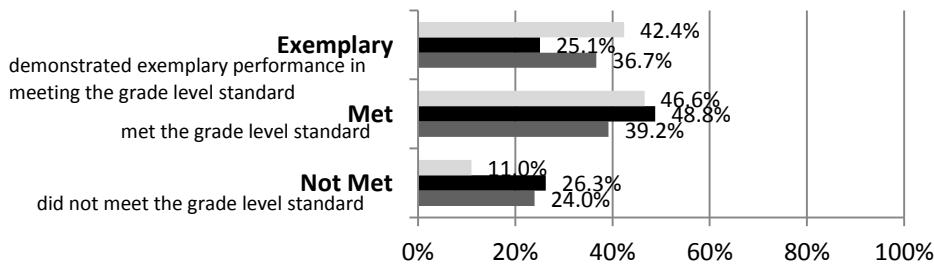
