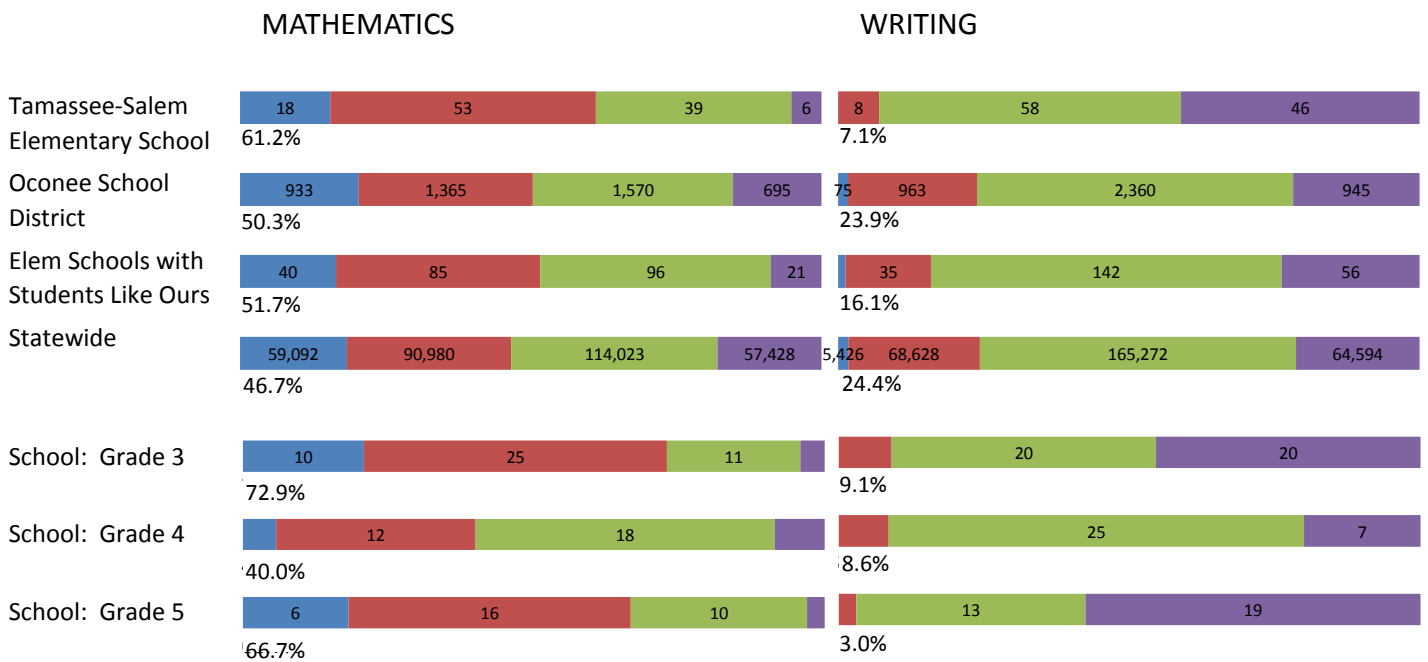

The mission of Tamassee-Salem Elementary is to provide a safe learning environment where all students reach their full potential. This statement is truly what drives every decision we make at Tamassee-Salem Elementary. Our teachers use Daily 5, guided reading groups, and flexible math grouping to deliver instruction in small group settings. At TSE, we analyzing state, district, and school wide formative and summative assessment data to drive our daily instruction to meet our students' academic needs. Our MAP (Measuring Academic Progress) data is one of the many data pieces we use to maximize enrichment and remediation opportunities for each student based on academic strengths and weaknesses. Our school wide focus is to maximize individual student growth through our instructional practices and delivery. We use MAP data, and other assessment data, as progress monitoring tools to help us challenge each student at individually appropriate levels to maximize individual academic growth. To further enhance academic growth, interpersonal skills, collaboration and teamwork, our students are provided many opportunities before, during, and after school hours to grow academically and socially. We have morning computer labs for ELA and Math remediation and enrichment, chorus, drama club, and art club for our students. Our guidance counselor provides monthly leadership skill and character development lessons to each class. We also have our Cougar Leaders program, which is a leadership building opportunity for our 5th grades students. Our PTO sponsored our Fall Festival, Winter Fundraiser, and Teacher Appreciation Week activities. Our SIC sponsored our annual Math and Science Night for our TSE families. Our students, staff, and families continue to have the opportunities to participate in service projects as well. Our Relay for Life team raised money for the American Cancer Society and our students participated in Jump Rope for Heart to raise money for the American Heart Association. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



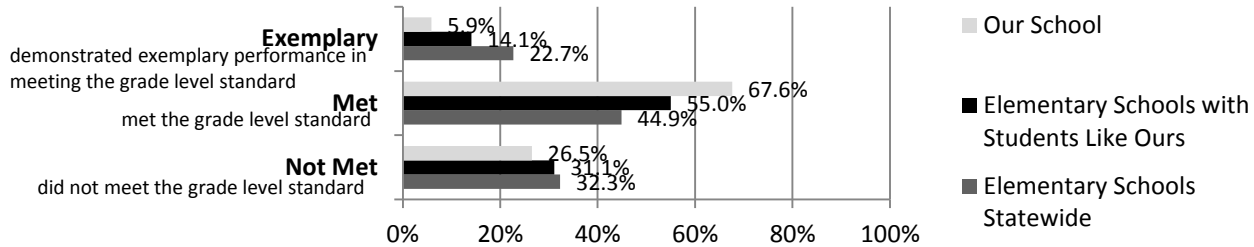

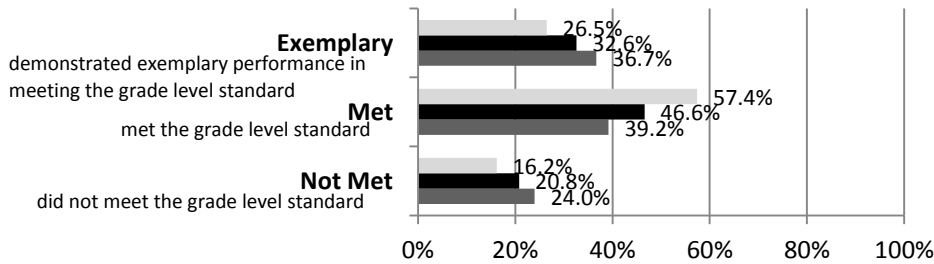
