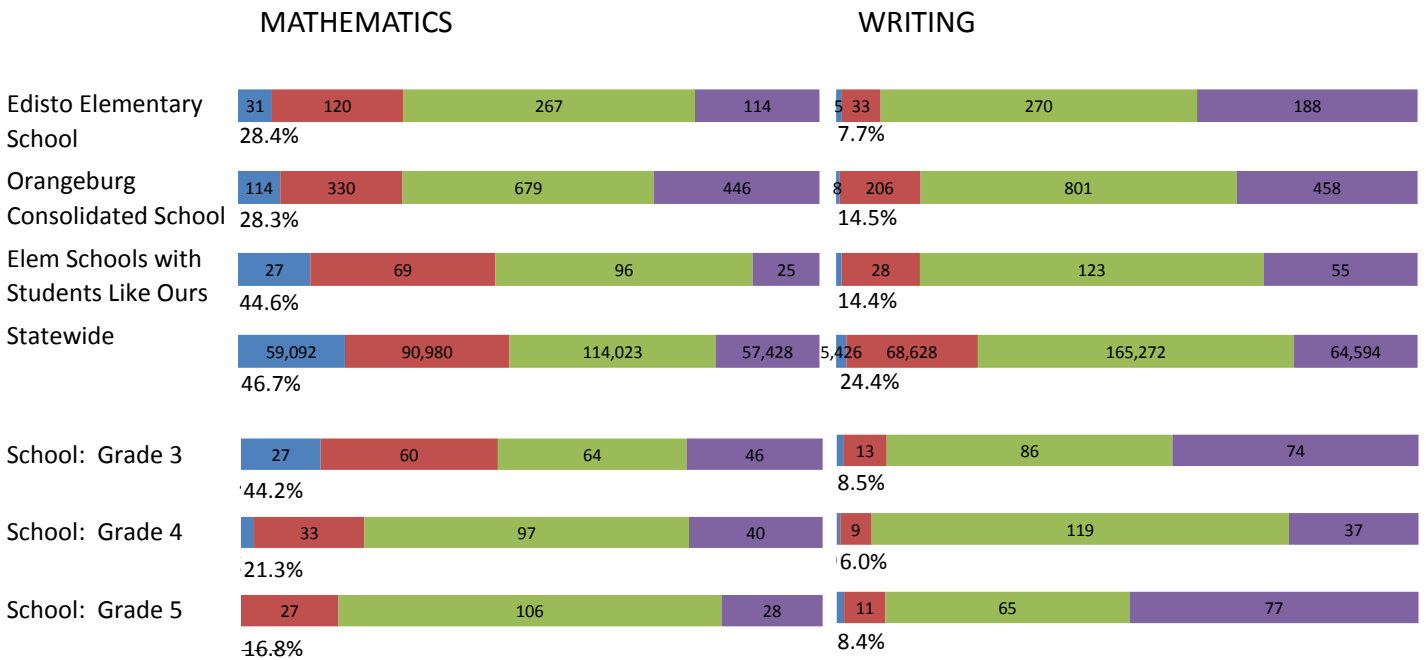
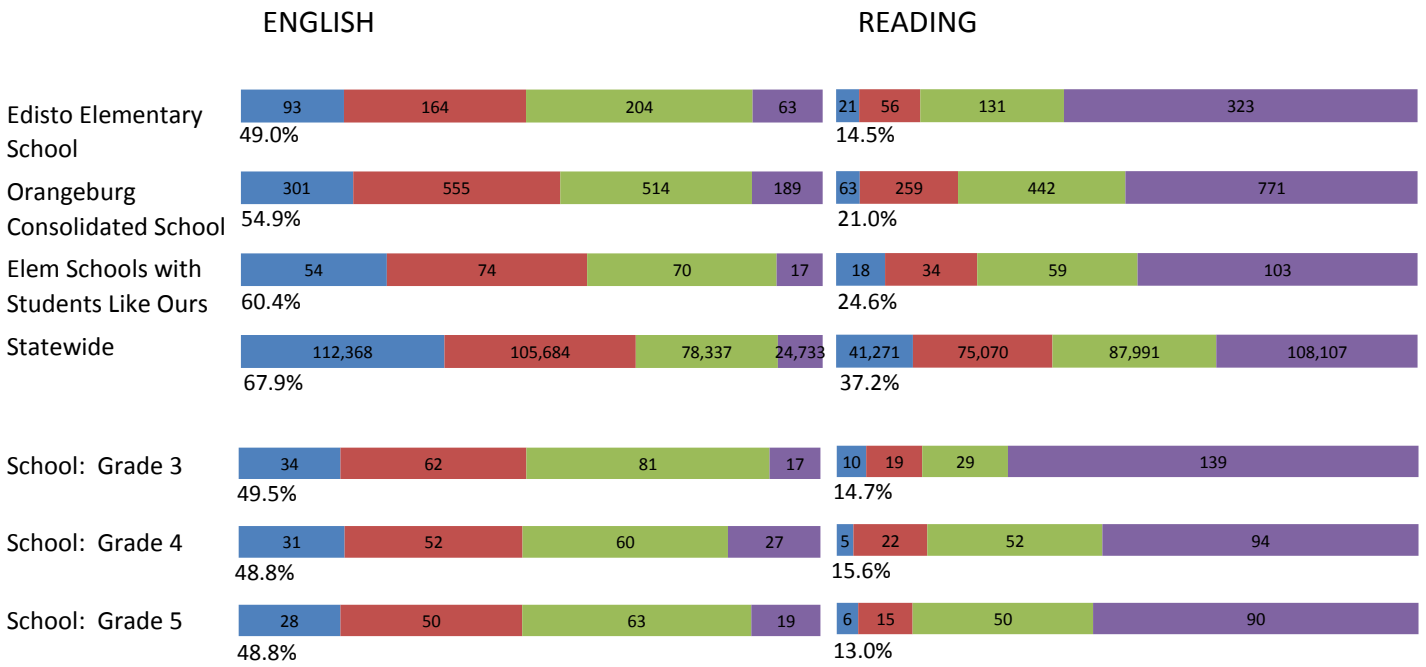
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Edisto Elementary School is helping all students develop global skills and the characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate in a positive student centered and academically challenging environment. With importance of EES vision, "United for Excellence" such an environment is created through partnership of school, home and community, best practices and professional development of our teachers. Our teachers provide instruction through engaging strategies such as Thinking/Concept Maps, Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI), Reading interventionist, flexible groups, guided reading, Fossil science kits, Accelerated Reader, Lucy Calkins Writing, literacy across content areas with the inclusion of technology for research and student guided learning. EES has various programs outside the realm of academics for character and life skills development. We continue to use Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) school wide. Our students are rewarded for making good decisions and exhibiting positive behaviors. As a culmination to PBIS, a student is recognized quarterly by grade level for outstanding citizenship. Our Brother and Sister Keepers Clubs have evolved through our partnership with "Call Me Mister" Program. The focus of these programs is to provide academic support and character building. EES has partnered with local businesses and government agencies to teach problem solving skills. The Si Group sponsors Healing Species which uses dogs to teach compassion and violence prevention. Moreover, our guidance counselor provides weekly classroom lessons that encompass a multitude of topics on careers and character building. To help instill a sense of community and humanitarian awareness, each year EES sponsors The Christmas Angel Tree and the Thanksgiving Food Drive. EES is also very active in raising funds for Relay for Life. We believe these opportunities help develop compassion and moral responsibilities in students. EES will continue its pursuit to work collaboratively with parents and community in the educational process and the development of the Profile of a South Carolina Graduate. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



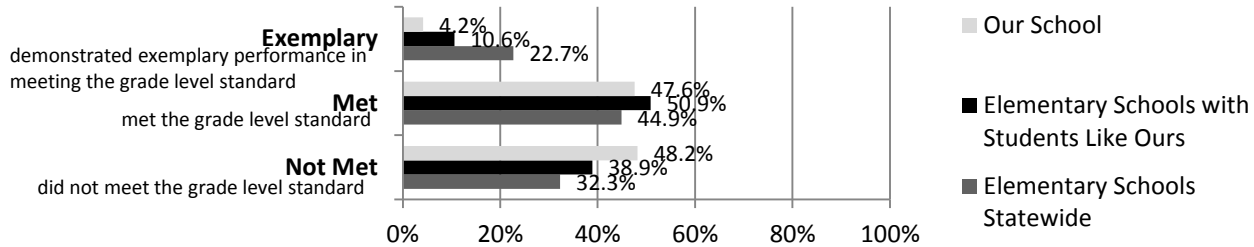

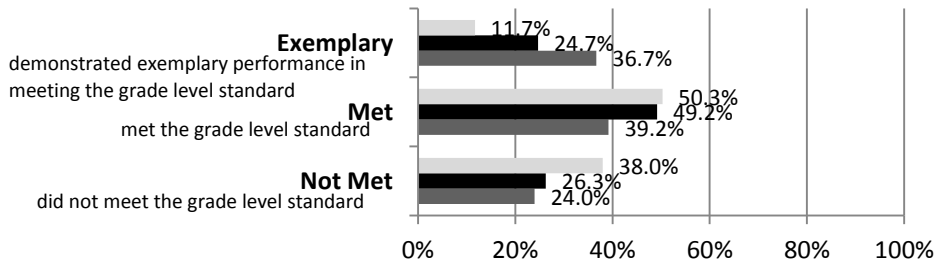
