
The academic program at Pontiac Elementary provides each child with instruction tailored to his/her learning needs. This year, a new Reading Coach position was added and our school wide literacy goals included enhancing independent reading time in the classrooms as well as ensuring that our classroom environments are literacy-rich according to the Classroom Environment Checklist. Pontiac is also home to a Montessori magnet program that serves 165 students from across the district. Our PDS partnership with the University of South Carolina continues to be a highlight of our school year, as we welcome new interns each year to learn alongside our teaching staff. School-wide events continue our tradition of excellence. Science Safari Day is an all-inclusive day of science activities for students. Arts Day focuses on arts in education. Disability Awareness Day teaches our students tolerance and compassion for others. Community partnerships are an integral part of these school-wide events. With the support of United Way of the Midlands, we welcomed reading volunteers this year from Verizon Wireless. Our students' artwork was posted at a local yogurt shop to affirm their good work!

Parent involvement is encouraged and embraced. Fall Fest, Family Math Night, and Literacy Night are just a few parent-friendly events that our school hosts. Watch DOGS has proved to be a wonderful asset to our building by involving our dads in our school culture. Dedicated and involved members of PTO and SIC provide leadership and a vision for excellence for the future. We strive to instill good citizenship through various clubs offered to students both during and after school. These school activities include chorus, news crew, Girls on the Run, Lego Robotics, Green Steps, and safety patrol. This year we became a Green Steps certified school, promoting school wide conservation and recycling efforts. We participated in service projects that included Jump Rope for Heart and Relay for Life at our school also. Our military connected students and their families are celebrated through participation in our Stars and Stripes club as well as during our Veterans Day program. Our students benefit from the technology-rich experiences that are embedded into the classroom. This year, several teachers implemented a Blended Learning Model, a model that promotes personalization of student learning. Our 4th grade students participated in Student TED Talks, learning how to present their big ideas in the form of short TED-style talks. The staff recognizes that building relationships with families and seeking out community partnerships will help enhance our students' educational experiences. Our ongoing goal is to provide unprecedented educational experiences that prepare our students for college and career readiness.




