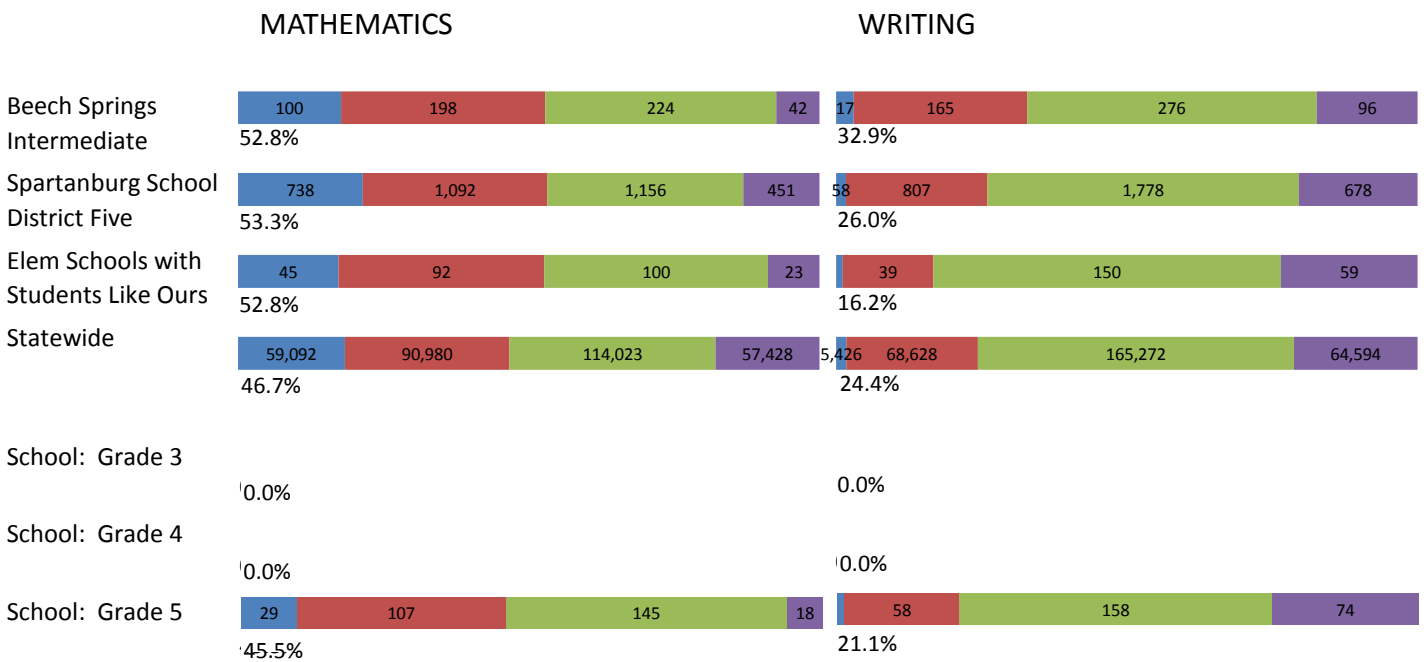
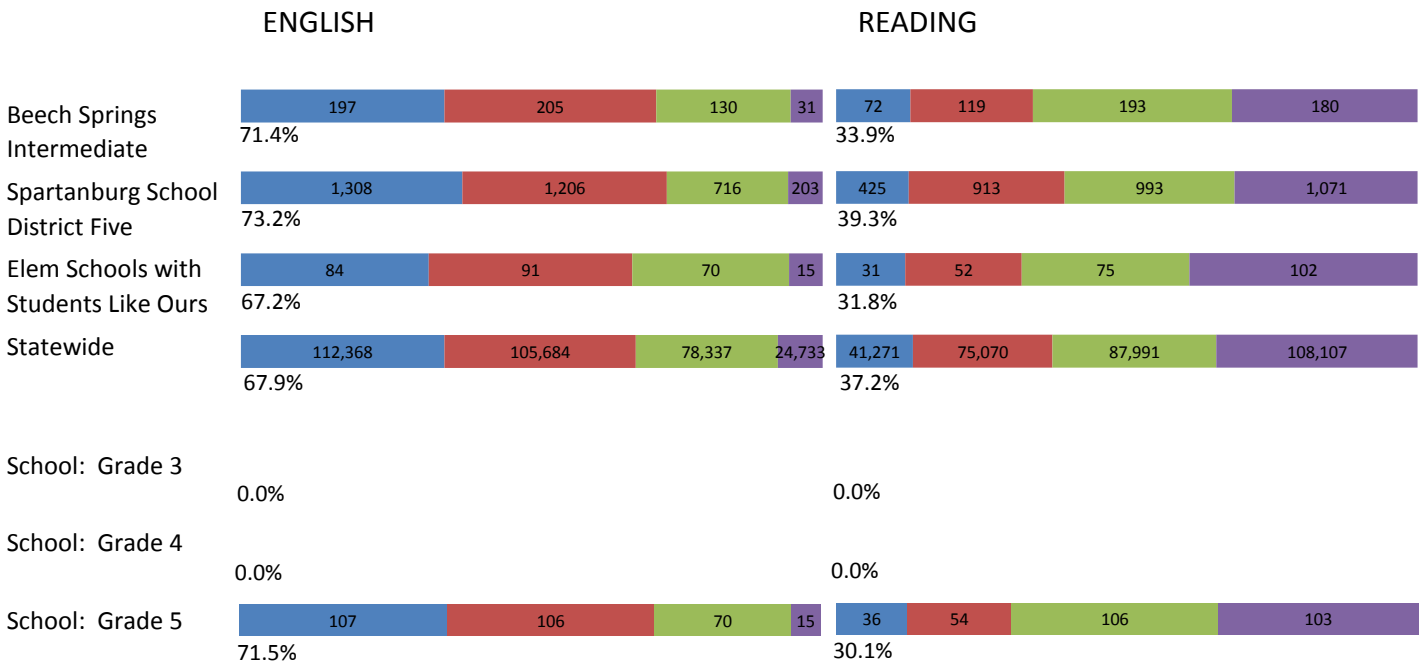

2014-2015 SIC Report to the People Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by implementing the SC standards in ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies. The standards are embedded with opportunities for creativity, innovation, critical thinking, problems solving, collaboration, teamwork, communication, information, media and technology. We have worked diligently to ensure that we have transitioned to these standards for teaching and learning. Although we will continue to work on these standards, we're pleased with the progress we have made thus far. We were able to partner with our neighboring district to provide professional development in the area of mathematics for our fifth and sixth grade teachers. We also used our very own teachers to provide professional development in the area of ELA. In addition to academics, our students have experienced a variety of opportunities in performing arts. For example, our band and orchestra students were able to take their talents to local concert festivals where both groups earned "Superior" ratings. Our chorus and "Treble Makers" participated in the concerts at the District Five Fine Arts Center. Students in Drama were able to bring their text books to life as they presented mini-plays based on their Social Studies standards. They also took their acting talents to the big stage as they presented Disney Jr.'s Mulan at the District Five Fine Arts Center. Leadership opportunities are plentiful for students. Students were able to participate in the iLead program, F.E.L.A.S (Future Entrepreneurs Leading, Achieving, and Succeeding), Beta Club, Drama, Chorus, Creations, Around the World Club, Morning News Show Crews, and Morning Leadership Patrol. Teachers have also provided ways for students to earn leadership roles in the classrooms. Our school has many accomplishments to celebrate. BSIS maintained a "Good" overall rating and an "Average" improvement rating on the SC Annual School Report Card. Our Parent Teacher Organization (PTO), a School Improvement Council (SIC), and business partnerships have been instrumental in the success of our school year. Additional opportunities for students include a reading intervention program (Leveled Literacy Intervention), ESOL (our program for speakers of other languages), our gifted/talented inclusion model, Creations (our gifted art program), RTI (response to intervention), and services for special needs. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



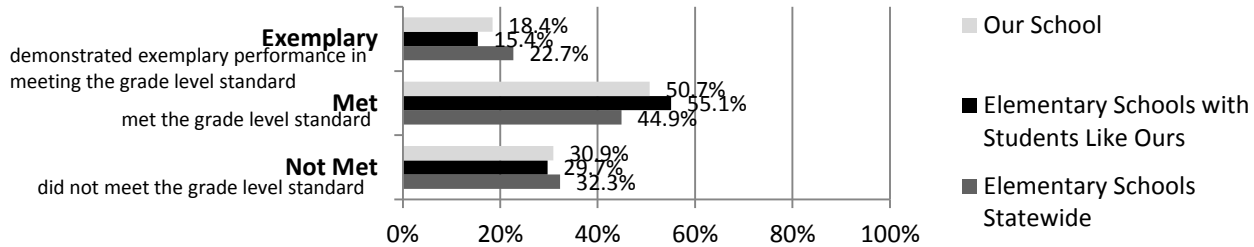

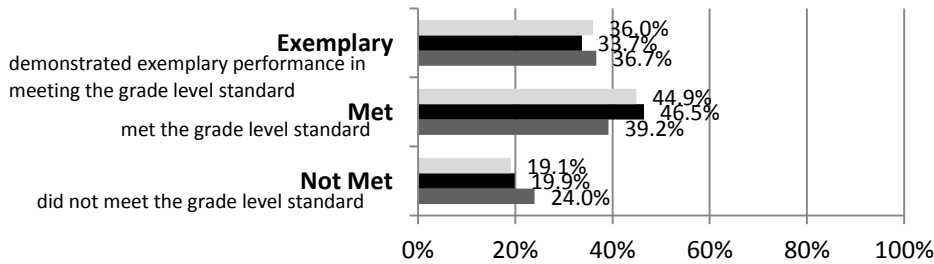
**KNOWLEDGE**
