Our students need the organizational and technical skills to compete in a global society. We believe it is our responsibility to develop our young students as leaders by providing them with the skills that will allow them to handle themselves in any given situation. Leadership is the foundation of everything that we do at Pauline-Glenn Springs Elementary. During the 2014-2015 school year, our students continued participating in "The Leader in Me" process and celebrated many personal and academic accomplishments through Leadership Days, goal-setting, data notebooks, and student-led conferences. Students are continuing to apply Dr. Steven Covey's 7 Habits of Highly Effective People to their everyday lives. Our 2014-2015 school-wide goal was to raise \$15,000.00 to drill a well in South Sudan in order to provide clean, safe drinking water for its people living in remote villages. All students in grades kindergarten through fifth grade read the book, *A Long Walk to Water*, the story of Salva Dut, a former "Lost Boy", who founded Water for Sudan. Students completed research on South Sudan and the problems stemming from unclean water. Research was presented to business and community leaders on our annual Leadership Day and students asked for pledges. In addition, our School Improvement Council sponsored a 5K Run, "Walk Awhile in Their Shoes" to raise money for the Sudan Project. We exceeded our goal and raised over \$17,000.00 which was donated to Water for Sudan. We continued to implement the Olweus Anti-Bullying Program this year. Students participated in weekly class meetings to discuss concerns and solutions pertaining to bullying. We also raised a total of \$1,170.00 during the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life Campaign. We appreciate the strong involvement of our PTO, School Improvement Council, parents, volunteers, and business partners. 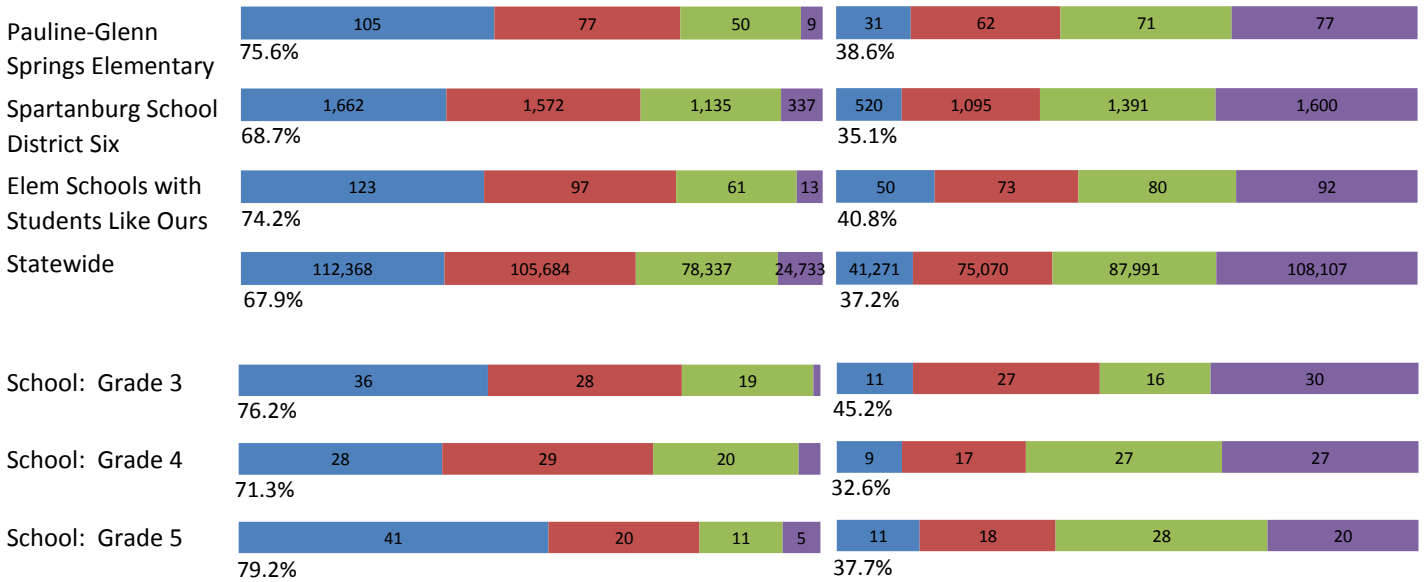

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing

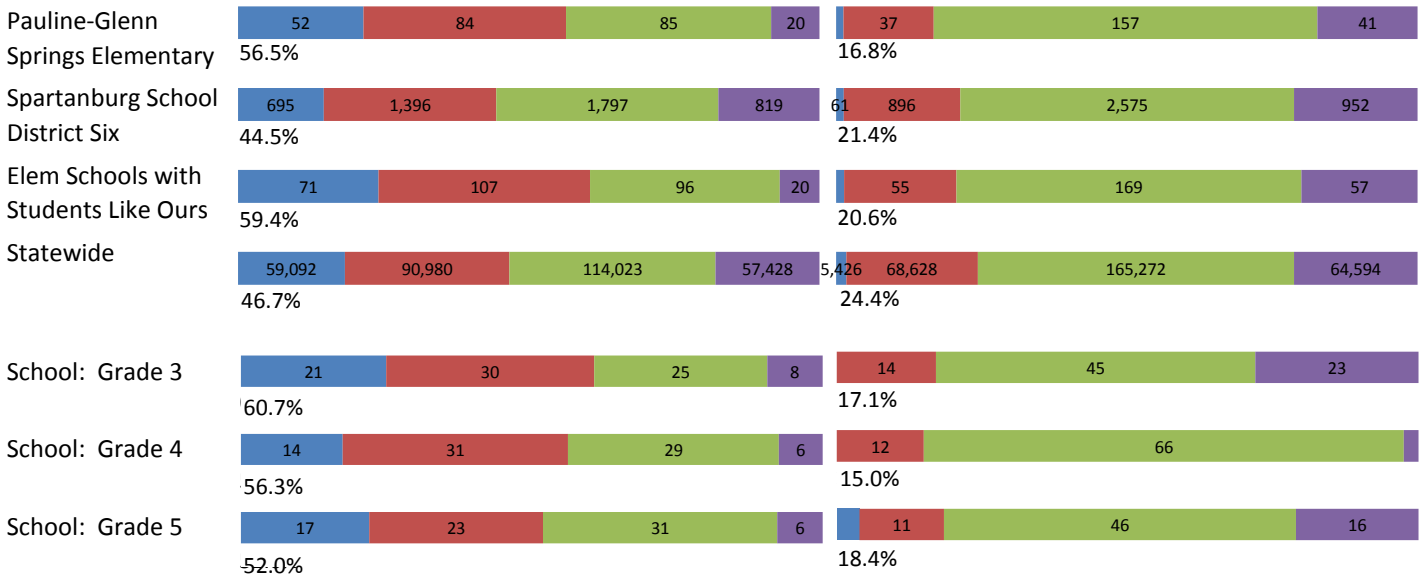

ACT Readiness Levels



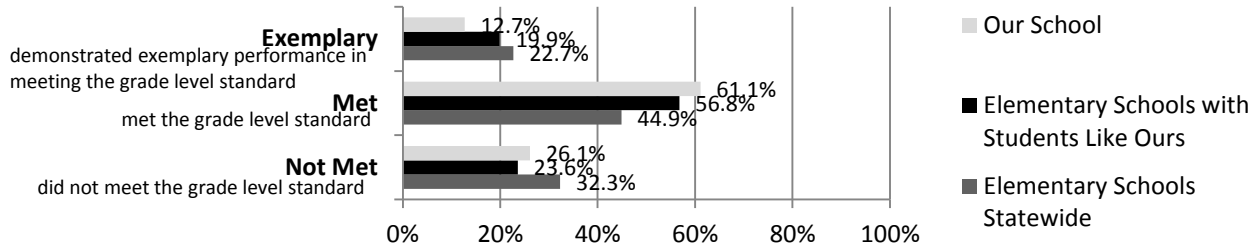

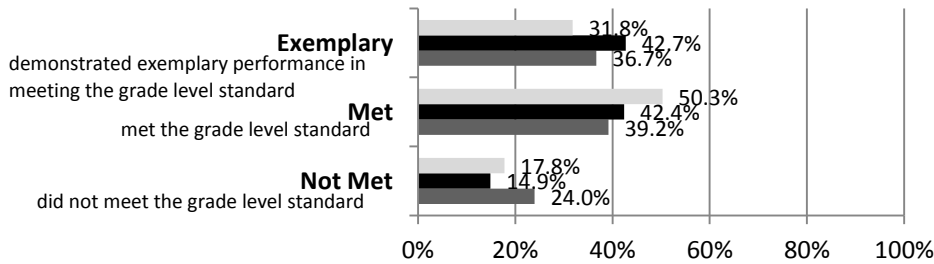
