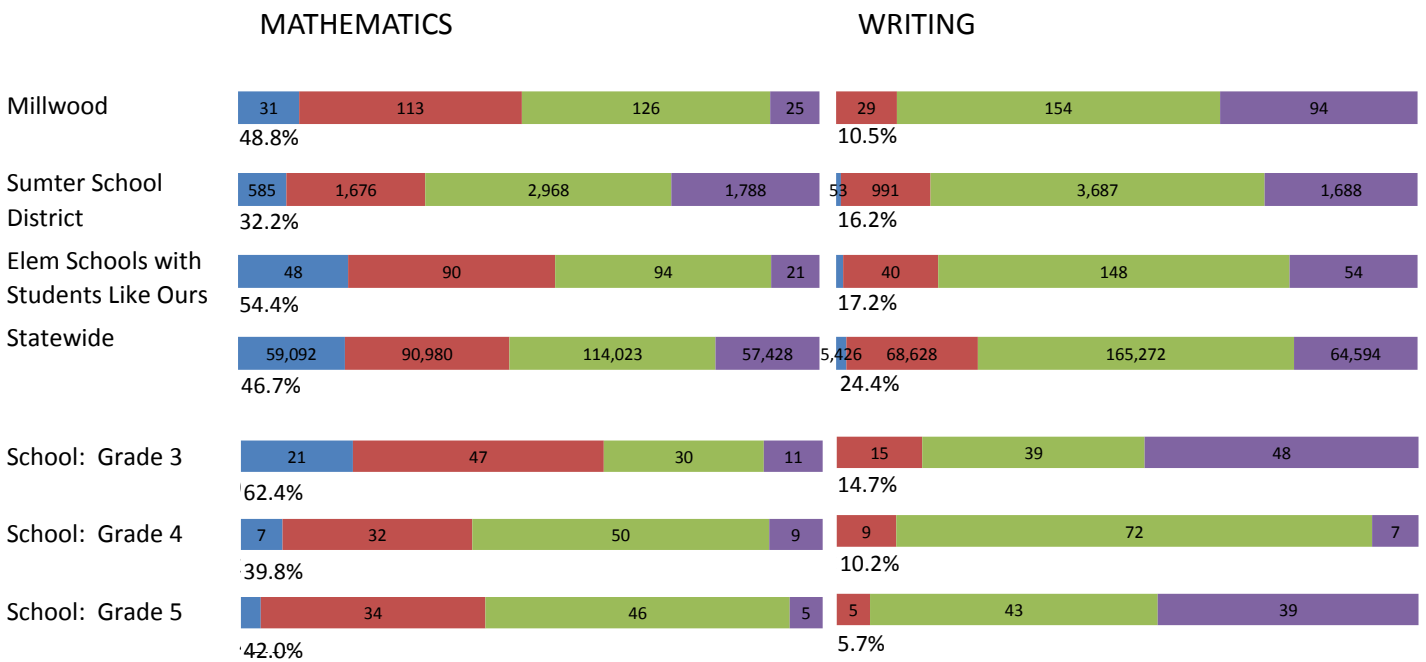

ACT Readiness Levels



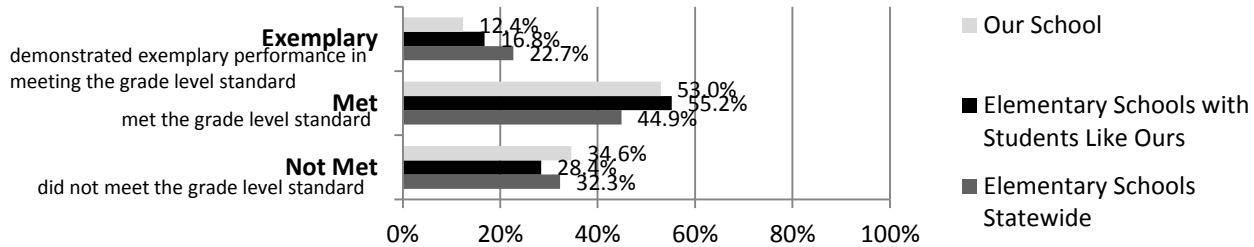

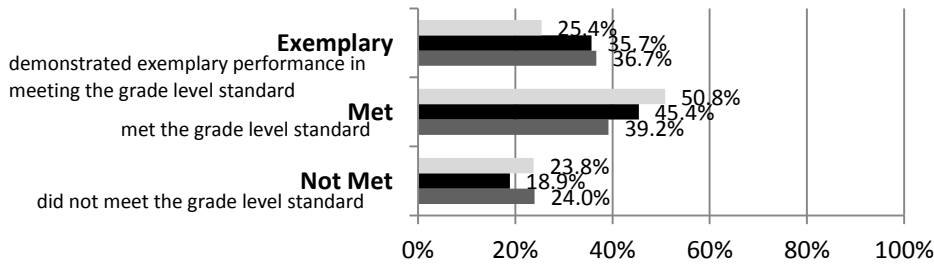
