

WORLD CLASS SKILLS & LIFE AND CAREER CHARACTERISTICS

It is the responsibility of Crescent High School to produce graduates who have the world class life skills and career characteristics of the SC Profile of the Graduate. We are working to accomplish this in many ways. The list below includes, but is not limited to, things that we are doing to help our students develop these skills. We provided staff development to our faculty on the traits of the SC Profile of the Graduate. We have expanded our Honors and AP course offerings to include Honors Physical Science, Honors Government, Honors Economics, AP Chemistry, and AP Biology. We are emphasizing Work Keys in all core classes. Our ELA teachers are incorporating Career 101 in their classes. Our ELA teachers teach research skills using "Big 6." We are adding College and Career Readiness to our master schedule. This course will have the 7 Healthy Habits embedded in the curriculum. The course will also cover EOC, ACT, and Work Keys skills. Financial literacy is taught in all business classes and these students have the opportunity to earn MOS and EviFi certifications. Google Apps, used by many institutions of higher learning and industries, is being added to our master schedule of classes. Our Career Development Facilitator assists students with job shadowing and work based learning opportunities. Jeff Craft was named our Teacher of the Year. Our Media Center hosted Banned Books Week and Teen Read Week as well as our faculty and student book clubs. To date, the Class of 2015 has earned over 3.7 million dollars in scholarships. There were 127 students who qualified for a Life Scholarship in the class of 2015. Our softball team won their 29th consecutive region championship. Our volleyball, wrestling, golf, and soccer teams qualified for the state playoffs. The staff of Crescent High School looks forward to engaging, empowering, and giving our students opportunities to excel in both academic and extracurricular pursuits. 
Average ACT Score Achieved by Students: English, Math, Reading, Science, Composite of all four tests, 2015**Average ACT Score Achieved by Students: Writing**

The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
