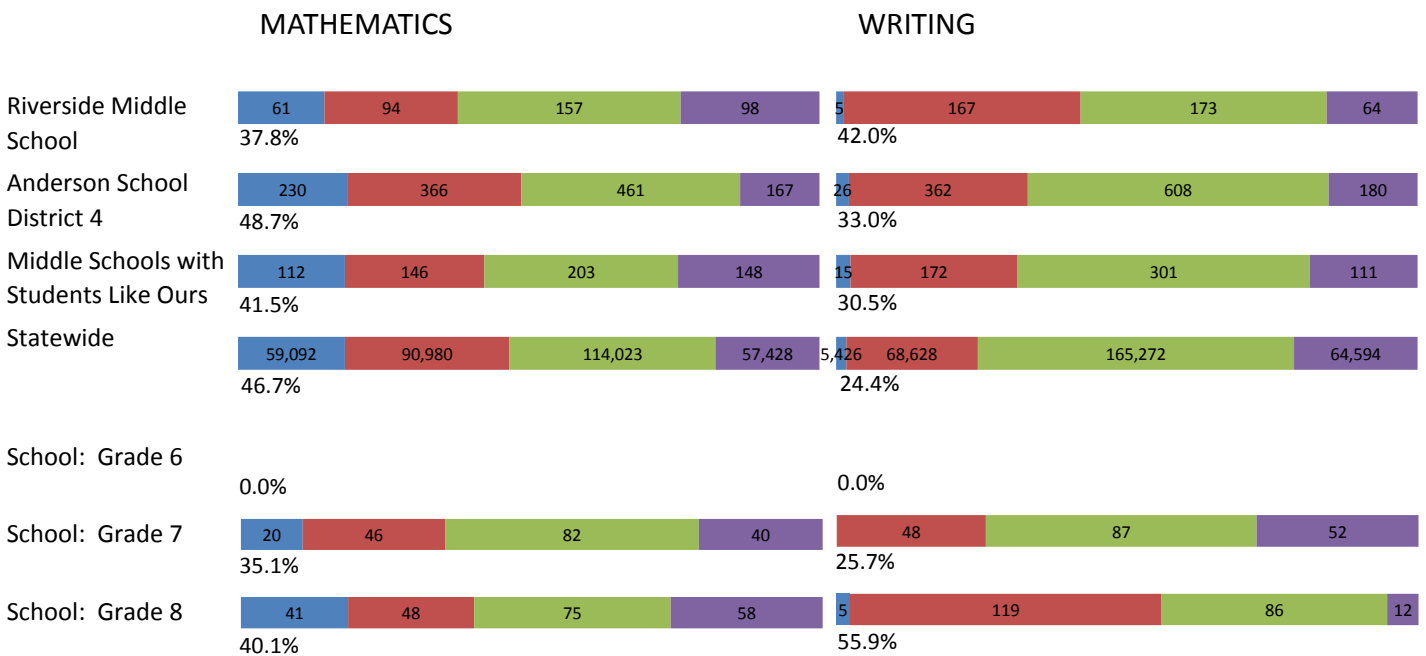

Our school/district is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by allowing learners to further develop transferable skills while building college and career readiness. We provide unique experiences that foster academic and personal growth for adolescents. A variety of offerings extend elementary pathways of arts integration, engineering, global studies, and leadership while preparing students for Schools of Study at PHS. The Pendleton area of SC is well-known for excellence in the arts. These signature experiences extend the development of creativity, innovative thinking, and problem solving. Middle school programs include band, chorus, creative writing, dance, debate, drama, foreign language, leadership, public speaking, multimedia communications, and visual arts. The RMS global studies program integrates social studies and language arts to promote awareness and appreciation of the world community. During their first year at the school, all students engage in learning world history through activities such as debate, role play, project-based learning, interactive technology, and field experiences. This knowledge may be further enriched through the introduction to world cultures exploratory course. RMS's nationally-recognized (ASDC) Whole Child initiative cultivates personal growth to ensure that students are healthy, safe, supported, challenged, and engaged. Programs include an adult-advocate mentoring program, a leadership development exploratory course, and school-wide Olweus bullying prevention. And, leaders in academics, behavior, and service to the community are recognized as Riverside Ambassadors, Beta Club members, and Riverside's Finest. Finally, community, business, education and government leaders realize that our students are facing economic and workforce development challenges. With a solid understanding of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) subjects and how they relate to the real world, are students are destined for success. To assist with mastery of technology skills, all students received a Chromebook for school and home use as part of the district's a 1:1 world initiative. This foundation is supported with an introduction to Career and Technology Pathways such as agriculture and pre-engineering, robotics, as well as advanced classes in mathematics. Through these opportunities students engage positively in project-based activities that integrate literacy along with STEM, such as green architecture and glider design.

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing



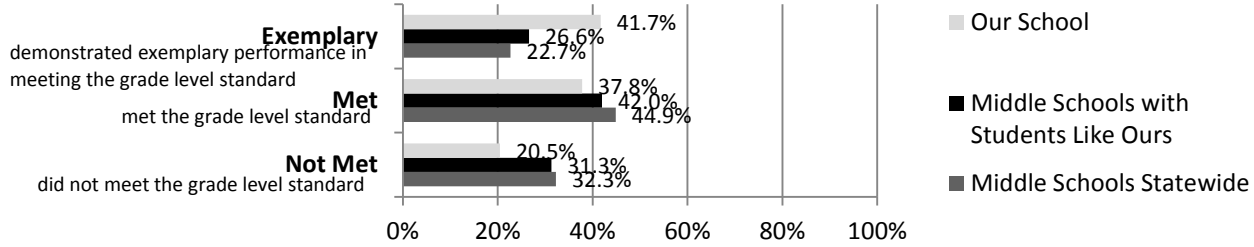

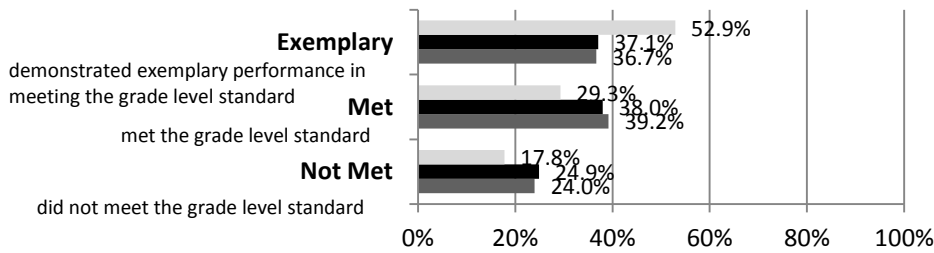
