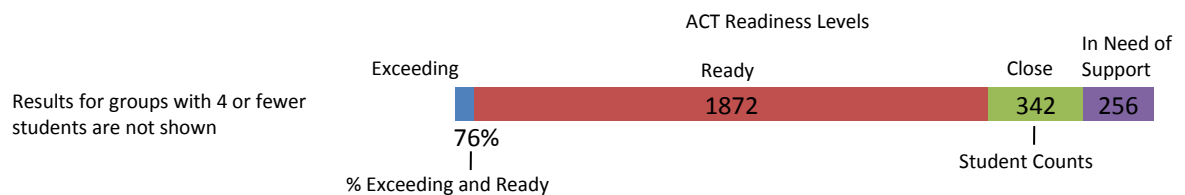
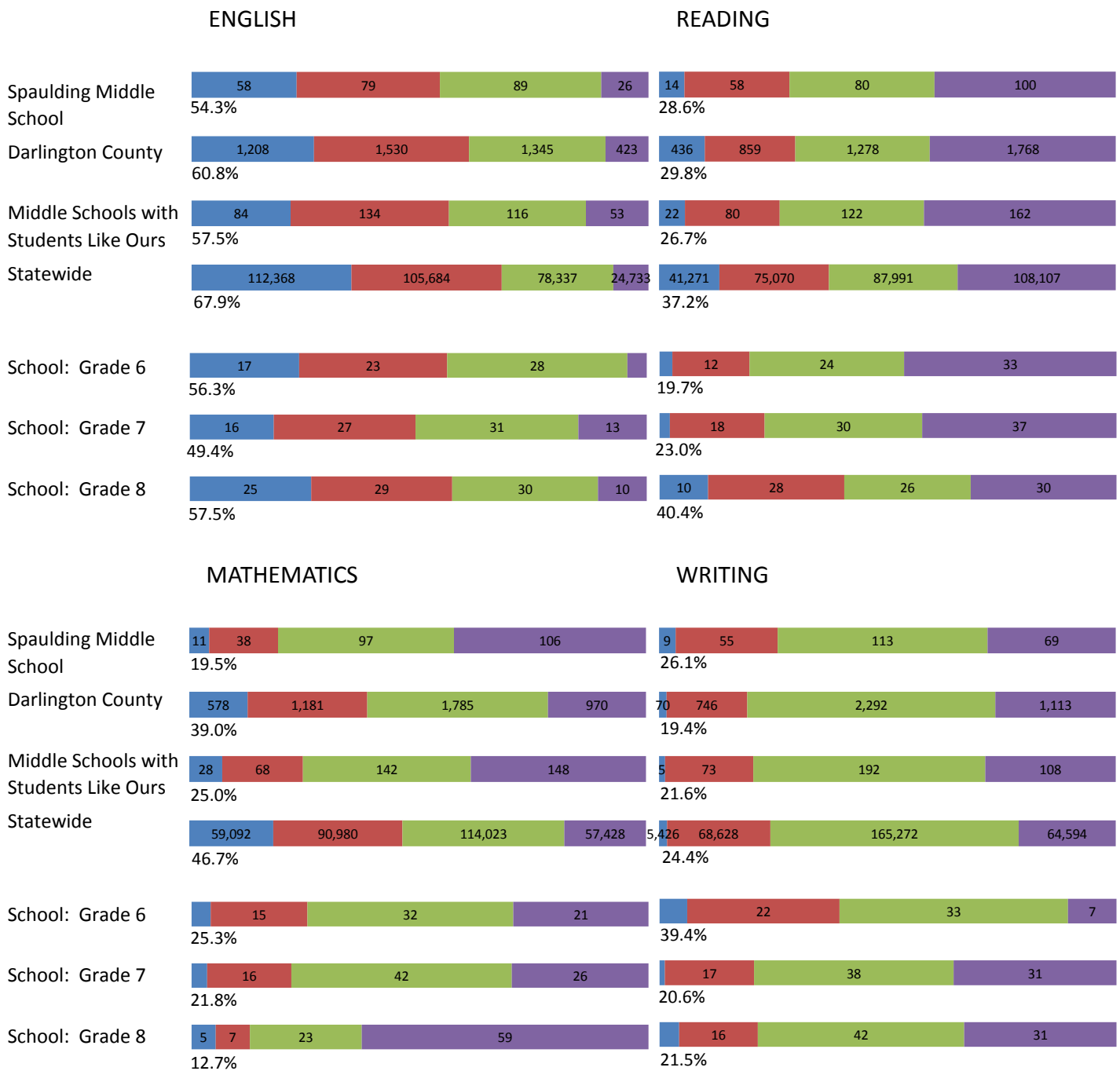

At Spaulding Middle, we strive each day to make learning meaningful, engaging, and rigorous. In collaboration with our families and community, we work to create a culture of excellence. Faculty and staff work diligently to ensure that the highest level of standards and exceptional practices are highly evident.

The students of Spaulding Middle School, a South Carolina Title I Distinguished School nominee, are continuously making tremendous gains. Highly effective teachers, challenging, rigorous curricula and engaging, technology-driven, instruction make Spaulding Middle School a great place for students to achieve. High student engagement in all classes, students' access to and continued use of iPads, and hands on experiences through science labs, field trips, and exploratory classes are just some of the ways that Spaulding Middle School proves to deliver quality student-centered instruction and experiences. Last year, more than half of the 8th grade students took advantage of the opportunity to travel to our nation's capitol, and almost all of the 6th and 7th grade students attended field trips to Discovery Place and Wonder Works, respectively. On-going, authentic professional development has been an integral component of our goal to provide quality instruction to our students. Teachers participate in weekly professional learning communities to collaborate and plan instruction. In addition, teachers attend local, state, and national professional development sessions. Teachers continue to facilitate high quality, engaging instruction for our students. Benchmark testing in ELA, math, science, and social studies continues to be a strategy used to measure student progress and provide data on student instructional needs. Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) is administered in ELA and math three times a year. Students participate in individual conferences with teachers to discuss test results and strategies for academic growth. In addition, targeted students are provided with the opportunity to have an additional hour of instruction with their English Language Arts and/or math teacher, where concepts and skills are reinforced in small group sessions. Our students continue to excel in extra-curricular activities. Our football team and the boys and girls basketball teams all had successful seasons. The academic challenge team represented our school well in all of its matches and demonstrated excellence in the regional conference. Our top-achieving students became eligible for membership in the Junior Beta Club. Our award winning music program continued to offer performing opportunities for our students and has earned numerous awards this year. The Robotics team, our newest organization at Spaulding Middle School, had a successful debut, as they came in first place in the Core Values competition. Eligible students also continue to do well in the Youth Leadership Program sponsored by the Darlington County Community Action Agency. 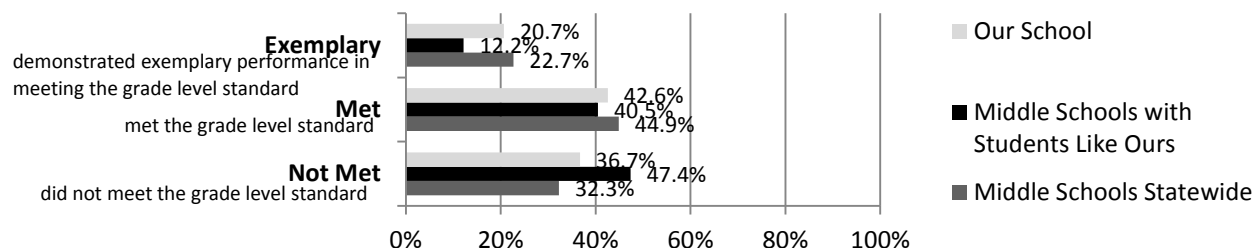
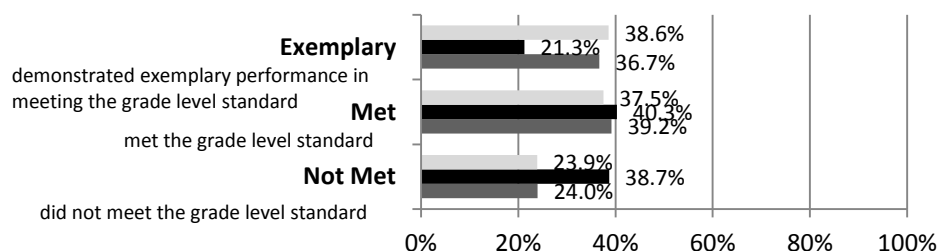
