

Building on the district's belief that all students can learn when immersed in a highly engaged environment, Kelly Mill Middle strives to build positive relationships within our school community, provide relevant and rigorous experiences, and enhance the learning environment for all students. We are very proud of our students' accomplishments this year. Kelly Mill had 21 Junior Scholars, as well as award-winning music programs. We have competitive teams for Math Counts, SC Finance Challenge Team, Step Team, Quiz Whiz, and Athletics. Our parent and community volunteers play a major role in the success of our school. They have contributed countless hours of their time, and are steadfast in helping make our organization more dynamic and effective. The staff at Kelly Mill provides our students with relevant and rigorous work that inspires them to inquire about the world around them. The AVID Program accelerates student-learning and encourages inquiry-based teaching methods. Kelly Mill is one of only two National AVID Demonstration sites in South Carolina. We use technology as an integral component of instruction. Each classroom is equipped with a Promethean Board, and all students have access to iPads, TI-Inspire calculators, and Chromebooks to ignite their curiosity. Honors classes are offered in English, math, science, and social studies. Kelly Mill INC, a competitive business and economics magnet program for the academically gifted, was recognized as a Magnet School of Excellence by Magnet Schools of America for the 2014-15 school year. INC. students were repeat champions in the SC Finance Challenge. Educators at Kelly Mill are provided with resources and professional development to enhance their ability to promote student success. As our school community continues to provide authentic, rigorous and engaging experiences for our students, it is our belief that if students focus and believe they will excel and achieve. The Center for Achievement, located on the campus of Kelly Mill Middle School, is an elementary magnet school designed for students with learning differences. The center consists of grades 2 through 6. There are 16 students per class, with a highly qualified teacher and an instructional assistant in each classroom. The school identifies students' strengths and provides strategies for their weaknesses. The students have shown growth and success on the nationally normed test administered, and is the proud recipient of the Palmetto Silver Award for the 2013-2014 school year. 


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
