The 2014-15 school year was filled with numerous learning opportunities for both students and staff. Focusing our efforts on improving student learning our teachers met twice each week for collaboration, planning and data reflection in their Professional Learning Teams to address the needs of some of our first grade emergent readers we added three full-time Reading Interventionists. A new small-group math intervention program proved very beneficial to second grade students. Kindergarten students who needed additional support with phonemic awareness were given one to one support with the addition of a part-time reading interventionist. This year we also celebrated two more teachers who earned National Board Certification, bringing our total to nine. Opportunities expanded for technology-based interactive learning as we launched the Berkeley County School District One to One Computing Initiative. Participating classrooms were provided with class sets of i-pads. This effort will double in 2015-16 as we increase the opportunities for our students to learn and our teachers to inspire our learners with the latest technology including Smartboards™, document cameras, digital cameras, Kindles™, i-pads, Chromebooks™ and classroom computers. In January we were fortunate to gain the assistance of a full-time mental health counselor that strengthened our collaboration with Berkeley County Mental Health and provided families with on-site counseling and referral services. Our two guidance counselors worked together to promote our Character Education program as we awarded 495 Outstanding Character medals to students who demonstrated behavior consistent with the monthly character traits. Parents supported our students at both Character Award ceremonies and the semester academic awards programs as well as several interactive and enriching family events. Our Title I program sponsored monthly School Improvement Council Meetings, Family Literacy Night, Family Math and Science Night and training for school volunteers. For the second year in a row we participated and were recognized as one of the top-rated schools in the Boeing/MUSC Wellness Program. This provided financial support for improving fitness and wellness for the GCP family. We want to thank our community and families for their on-going support and look forward to another year of learning and growing.
