

2014-15 Title I Reward Schools – South Carolina’s ESEA / Federal Accountability System

Reward Schools for Progress are Title I schools that demonstrate the most substantial progress in either the “all students” group or in identified subgroups from one school year to the next.

- To determine a Reward School for Progress, a Title I school must:
 - have attained an “A”, “B”, or “C” in the two most recent school years.
 - have a free/reduced lunch count that is greater than 50 percent.
 - be one of the top ten percent of qualifying Title I schools that demonstrate progress in the performance of all students or in subgroups on statewide assessments or make substantial progress increasing the graduation rate.
 - have at least one tested grade on state assessments.
