**ORDER OF SUSPENSION
(BREACH OF CONTRACT)**

SUMMARY OF THE CASE

The South Carolina State Board of Education (State Board) considered this matter on January 12, 2020. On October 2, 2020, the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) sent Chloe Mcleod Jeffords a notice via regular and certified mail of her right to a hearing regarding the possible suspension of her South Carolina educator certificate. The delivery notice noted that the item had been delivered to an agent for final delivery on October 8, 2020, as evidenced by postal tracking. The SCDE has verified Ms. Jeffords' address and the letter sent via regular mail has not been returned. On November 3, 2020, the SCDE informed Ms. Jeffords via regular mail that the State Board would meet on December 8, 2020, or as soon thereafter as is feasible, to consider action against her educator certification. Under the South Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure 5(b), Ms. Jeffords has been given fair notice of constitutional due process. Ms. Jeffords has not contacted the SCDE to request a hearing and is now in default.

After considering the evidence presented, the State Board voted to suspend Ms. Jefford's educator certificate for a period of one year, commencing January 12, 2021, and ending on January 11, 2022.

FINDINGS OF FACT

This case concerns a formal complaint of the Richland County School District Two (District) seeking the suspension of the educator certificate of Chloe Mcleod Jeffords for breach of contract. The State Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 59-25-150 (2018) and S.C. Code Ann. § 59-25-530 (2018).

On April 9, 2020, Ms. Jeffords signed a contractual agreement with the District to serve as a teacher for the 2020-2021 school year. On August 20, 2020, Ms. Jeffords

submitted her resignation to the District, effective August 20, 2020. In her resignation, Ms. Jeffords claimed she was concerned about possible face-to-face teaching during the Covid-19 pandemic. On August 25, 2020, the District informed Ms. Jeffords she would not be released from her contract until a suitable replacement was found. The District Board voted to report Ms. Jeffords' breach of contract to the SCDE on September 8, 2020. The District reported the matter to the SCDE on September 10, 2020.

After considering the evidence, the State Board finds that the evidence presented demonstrates that Ms. Jeffords breached her contract with the District, and that just cause exists to suspend Ms. Jeffords' certificate 262282 for a period of one year, commencing on January 12, 2021, and ending on January 11, 2022.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

"The South Carolina Board of Education may, for just cause, either revoke or suspend the certificate of any person." Just cause includes, *inter alia*, "unprofessional conduct" and "willful violation of the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education." S.C. Code Ann. § 59-25-160 (3) and (4) (2018). Pursuant to 24 S.C. Code Regs. 43-58 (2) and (14) (2018), the State Board of Education had the legal authority to suspend a certificate for "failure to comply with the provision of a contract without the written consent of the local school board." With respect to breach of contract, "any teacher who fails to comply with the provisions of his [or her] contract without written consent of the school board shall be deemed guilty of unprofessional conduct." S. C. Code Ann. § 59-25-530 (2018). "Upon formal complaint of the school board, substantiated by conclusive evidence, the state board shall suspend or revoke the teacher's certificate, for a period not to exceed one calendar year." *Id.*

The State Board finds that the evidence presented demonstrates that Ms. Jeffords breached her contract without the consent and/or approval of the District. Accordingly, the evidence presented supports the State Board's determination that just cause exists to suspend the educator certificate of Ms. Jeffords for a period of one year, commencing on January 12, 2021, and ending on January 11, 2022.

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If Ms. Jeffords wishes to have her educator certificate reinstated at the end of the suspension period, she shall make a written request to the SCDE's Office of Educator Services, and shall meet all certification requirements in effect at the time she requests reinstatement. Ms. Jeffords shall also pay the applicable reinstatement fee. The suspension of Ms. Jeffords' educator certificate 263282 shall be reported to the NASDTEC Clearinghouse and all South Carolina school districts within thirty days from the date of this order, with the reason stated as "unprofessional conduct, breach of contract, willful neglect of duty, and failure to comply with the provisions of a contract without the written consent of the local school board."

AND IT IS SO ORDERED.
